I had to defer writing to you
time and again owing to my physical
condition, and to a rheumatic inflam-
mation of my finger joints which makes
letter-writing an arduous and painful
task. - Through my ailment, the nature
of which was explained at some length
in my letter to you of Decr. 27. '05, I
have for now nearly six years been con-
fined to the house, occasional short
walks within a radius of a few blocks
excepted, and in June 1906 I had finally
to retire from the active practice of the
profession (see enclosed cards). Though
I have ever since been hoping for an im-

turn of my earning capacity, this expect-
ation has not been realized so far, and it
is with extreme reluctance that, in here-
with enclosing my check for \$15.--, dues
for 1906, I now feel moved to make ap-

Section 1. of the By-Laws, to be exempted
from the payment of dues commencing
with 1907, the year after my retirement,
having not engaged in any other pro-
fession or business since.

I would also request that your fu-

as the prompt delivery to me of mail matter
addressed to my son's office has been occasi-
onally delayed when through absence from the
city or otherwise, he was prevented from taking
the same home with him. -
