Dear Mr. Kemper:

It has been sometime since we have "bumped into" one another, and, as usual. on this occasion I am asking a favor.

I would like to have some information as to who and what Mr. Alfred Kastner, Architect, of Washington, D. C., is.

After the hurrican hit Albany, Georgia, in February, the City thought it a good idea - and apparently it was a good idea - to employ an Architect who would act as a coordinating agent for the purpose of harmonizing the designskof the various Architects who might have work in the re-building of Albany. This particular Architect was not to handle any of the new work as Architect. The Architects who were here met with a Citizens Committee, Mr. Hal Henz proposed Mr. Toombs and I suggested Mr. Francis Smith, both of Atlanta, as being available and competent. However, Mr. Francis Shurling, Director of Emergency Relief Council out of Washington, suggested a Mr. Kastner of Washington, as being an outstanding Architect, Town Planning expert, etc., etc. The City was prevailed upon to employ Mr. Kastner. No sooner had he landed than he sold the city officials on the idea of his designing the "store fronts", etc., for such owners who were trying to put their property back in rentable shape without the services of Architects. He employed two young draftsmen just out of college and went to it.

The City had some proposed work which was to be submitted to W. P. A. Kastner offered to prepare sketches for this work "in order to expedite an application to W. P. A." - when everyone knows that W. P. A. requires that complete working drawings and specifications accompany all applications.

Kastner has taken quite a few jobs for owners who had already started Architects working on preliminary sketches, and the owners, of course, simply walked out on the Architects. Now he has about sold the City on the idea that, if they employ him as Architect on the proposed municipal work, about \$150,000.00 worth, he will through his "influence" in Washington, secure approval of their projects by W.P.A. and, will refund from his commission as Architect, the money which the City has paid him as coordinator.

This is such a flagrant case of unprofessional conduct - and one which I

cannot conceive of the W.P.A. officials approving - that I have just about come to the conclusion that Kastner is far from what he was supposed to be.

Kastner has told some of the City officials that he is a member and an officer of the American Institute of Architects. From what little information we have on the man, it seems that he came to America from Germany nine years ago as an expert cabinet maker, married some money and branched out into Architecture; worked with the Government a while with the department of Agriculture and later opened an office in Washington with a Russian as partner.

Naturally, the Architects here are rather up in arms over such an instance and I am particularly anxious to secure all possible information on the man. Anything you may be able to give me will be greatly appreciated and, of course, your name or that of the Institute would not be mentioned. Many thanks.
