Dear Sir:

I am enclosing my application for membership in the Institute together with such exhibits as I have available at present.

I am at present in California recovering from an illness and have not very much material for a representative exhibit at my disposal just now, but trust that what I am sending will be sufficient. I am enclosing photographs of three executed buildings together with a letter from ~~Ray~~ Bass, Knowlton & Co., Indianapolis, stating that they were done under my direction while acting as their chief draftsman.

I am also enclosing such working drawings, studies, etc. as I happen to have with me, in lieu of a more complete exhibit. Among these are some of my studies for the Estate of James Deering at Miami, Florida, of which Mr. Paul Chalfin was the architect and decorator. I did considerable work on that project.



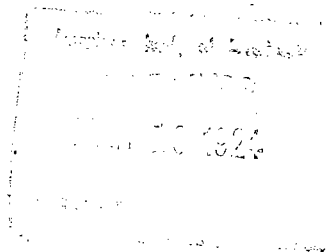

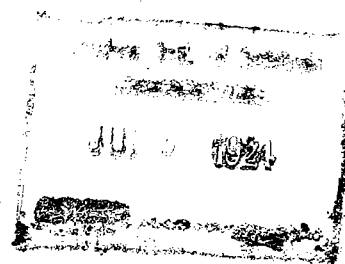
