## OBITUARIES

# John Andrews Dies at 66; Longtime Area Architect

John Richards Andrews, 66, a Washington architect for 35 years, died of leukemia July 7 at home in Washington.

Mr. Andrews, who had an independent practice, designed all of the Clyde's restaurants built in the last 20 years, including those in Tysons Corner and Reston, and the Old Ebbitt Grill in Washington. He designed buildings and reconstruction projects for schools and churches, including National Cathedral School, Gallaudet University, St. Patrick's Episcopal Day School and the New Southern Rock Baptist Church in Washington, Holton-Arms School in Bethesda, Goucher College in Towson, Md., and the Federal Mine Health and Safety Academy in Beckley, W.Va.

He was chairman of the Old Georgetown Board of the Commission of Fine Arts from 1989 to 1991 and also had served as chairman of the D.C. Architectural Registration Board.

Mr. Andrews had been a trustee of the House of Mercy in Washington and the Holton-Arms School, a vestryman at St. Patrick's Episcopal Church and a member of the Chevy Chase Club, the Cosmos Club and the St. Andrews Society.

He was an assistant lacrosse coach at St. Albans School for 10 years. His hobbies included golf.

He was born in Rochester, Minn., and moved to Baltimore as a child. He graduated from the school of architecture at the University of Virginia and served in the Marine Corps from 1954 to 1956.

Survivors include his wife of 40 years, Virginia T. Andrews, and three children, Courty Andrews, Catherine Heffron and Thomas Andrews, all of Washington; his mother, Beulah Andrews of Rochester, Minn.; a sister, Elizabeth Gardner of Orlando, Fla.; a brother, Donald Andrews of New York, and a grandchild.
