

- * A major senior high school arranged on a limited site requiring extensive use of two story construction. Curtain wall treatment provides new departure for large school system previously committed to concrete or masonry exterior walls and double hung wood windows.
- ** One of the first "school-within-a-school" projects completed in California. Follows the concept of three grade levels, each with its own academic class-rooms, shop, craft and homemaking facility. Received special citation by American Association of School Administrators at Atlantic City.

Within the past few months I have established residence in Sedona, Arizona, practically as a place of retirement.


Although it is not my intention to open an office here and actively practice, I have applied for and have been granted registration in this state.
