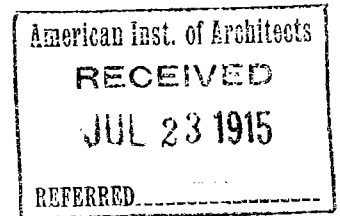

I regret to inform you that my partner
Mr. Robert A. Bethune, a member of the American Institute of Arch-
itects passed away in Buffalo on Saturday ^{July} ~~August~~ 17, 1915.

Mr. Bethune was born June 7, 1855 in Bowmanville, Ontario
his family later moved to Windsor, Ontario and Detroit, Michigan.
He began the study of Architecture with Gordon W. Lloyd of Detroit
and was later with R. A. Waite of Buffalo. He began business for
himself in 1881 with Mrs. Bethune under the firm name of R. A. &
L. Bethune and in 1890 added William L. Fuchs to the partnership
under the firm title of Bethune, Bethune & Fuchs. Since the death
of Mrs. Bethune in 1913 the firm title has been Bethune & Fuchs.

Mr. Bethune married Louise Blanchard in Buffalo on
December 10, 1881. Mrs. Bethune was at one time a member of the
American Institute of Architects. Dr. Charles W. Bethune, son
resides in Buffalo. N. Y.
