
This is in response to your letter of October 24.

The Committee on Errors and Omissions Insurance has been retitled Committee on Professional Liabilities. It is at present awaiting final draft of a new errors and omissions insurance form which the insurance agent expects to have available within the next two weeks. If that form is acceptable to the committee, it will recommend to the Board of Directors that the Institute advise the membership of that fact. We are advised that if the Institute likes the proposed policies, they can be made ready for sale to the membership by January or February at the latest.

At present, policies on errors and omissions, which cover only defects resulting in property damage or bodily injury, can be obtained through the General Accident Assurance Corporation, 4th & Walnut Streets, Philadelphia 3, Pa. There is no policy now which gives full protection, except individual policies which can be purchased through Lloyds of London, and which, we understand, are quite expensive.

We shall keep the membership fully informed on developments as promptly as possible. The Board of Directors meets the last week in November.
