





The Chicago Chapter phoned regarding your letter to the Chapter dated December 7 and asked us to respond.

You are aware that all members (and respolicants) who are owners and managers in organizations justing registered architects to perform professional services are liable for supplemental dues, in addition to regular dues.

The matter of company payment or reimbursement on <u>any AIA</u> dues is one between member and firm. It can be a factor in deciding whether or not to join the AIA, but it is not a factor in determining how much dues one has to pay to maintain membership.

The name "Belli & Belli Co." appears on your letterhead which would imply that you have ownership or managerial position in the firm. "Belli & Belli of Missouri, Inc." is listed in the 1980 edition of Profile of American Architectural Firms with your name as the AIA member in charge. On the surface at least, it seems that you would be responsible for supplemental dues in order to be an AIA member.
