

- (k) Stimulated the participation of Ohio Architects in legislative committee hearings (1967 session) which resulted in badly needed adjustments in professional salaries.

NOMINEE'S ACHIEVEMENT IN PUBLIC SERVICE

1. List the public offices held by the nominee and the positions of trust held by him in recognition of civic leadership, and state clearly his notable work in public service and the particular influence of that work which the nominators believe to be a notable contribution to the advancement of the profession.

State Architect and Engineer from February 15, 1958 to the present time, which has comprised a tour of active participation of Public Works Programs of three administrations and three major Bond programs. The 1958 Bond Issue of \$100,000,000.00 was supplemented by another \$100,000,000.00 for a total program of \$200,000,000.00. The next issue in 1962 was for \$150,000,000.00 and the 1966 issue of \$292,000,000.00. These Bond issues were over and above the normal appropriations for Capital Improvements.

The nominee is thus responsible for design and construction of approximately \$500,000,000.00 in state projects. They include every type of project from facilities of higher education to power houses, water and sewage treatment plants, youth camps, branch colleges, new universities, community and technical colleges, facilities for Youth Commission, Metal Hygiene and Correction, Bureau of Unemployment Compensation, Highway Department, Highway patrol, and all other departments of State, except Natural Resources and Adjutant General.

The nominee also acts as Consultant to The Ohio Board of Regents, Historical Society, Underground Parking Commission, and the State Department of Libraries.

The overall current program constitutes some 400 projects and has required the appointment of some 150 Architectural and Engineering Firms.

Although most major projects are designed by Associated Architects, the State Architect's organization accomplished some \$15,000,000.00 in projects in addition to the necessary writing and administering of some 900 contractors' contracts, numerous conferences, overseeing of construction and processing of some 300 Change Orders and 900 Contractors' Estimates each month.

The nominee successfully met his responsibility to establish such an organization and to develop administrative procedures which are efficient but not a burden on the taxpayer. He administers an adequate, but limited staff of qualified professional, technical and administrative personnel numbering 53.

Equitable fee arrangements for typs of facilities were established and coordinated with local architects and engineers associations.

Standard office practices were developed for both architect and engineer. Design responsibilities as well as the handling of administrative activities such as letters, change orders, and invoices of both architect and contractor.

A major requirement has been the development of an Architect-Engineer Handbook to guide the Associate Architect and which completely informs him of all standard procedures and requirements for his activities for submittal and approvals by the State Architect's Division; also in conjunction with this handbook, it was necessary to extablish guide specifications for Architectural, Mechanical and Electrical work.

In the initial stages of the program acceleration of building cost was apparent. In order to offset such costs, the nominee commissioned an Associate Architect to visit California to investigate a Modular System of Design which had been developed by The Ford Foundation. This program was far too complex and required too much time to implement.

Through consultation with the Associate Architect, the nominee was able to develop a more direct approach to fit the Ohio building environment and this Modular System was successful. (It has reduced the normal higher education facility cost from \$21.00 per square foot to \$14.00 per square foot on a rising market. This price also included air conditioning).

The major portion of the design phase of the program has been completed and most projects are under construction.

This program has been accomplished and continues with the full cooperation and participation of the Architects of the State of Ohio.
