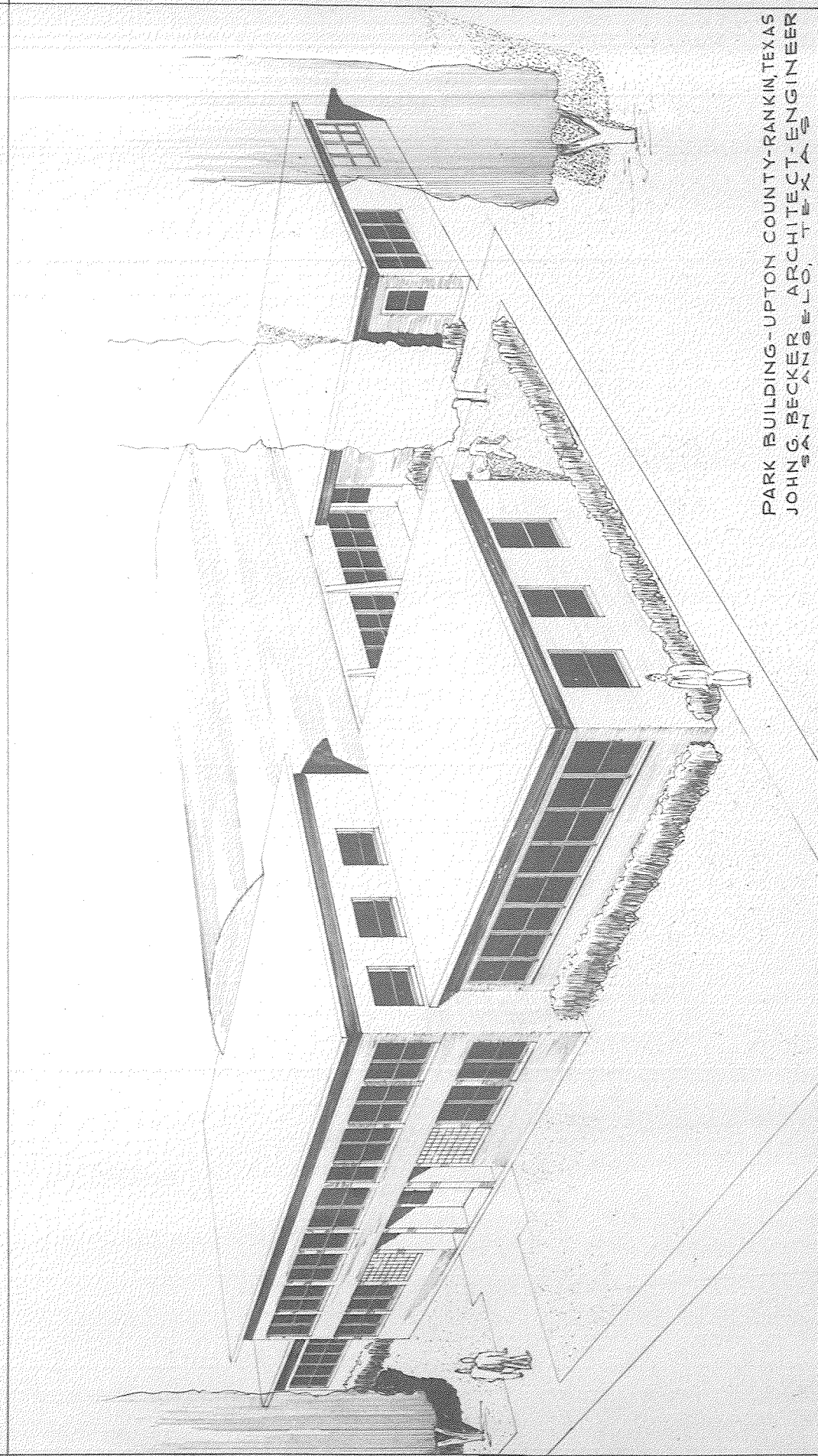


REMODEL OF LLANO COUNTY COURTHOUSE

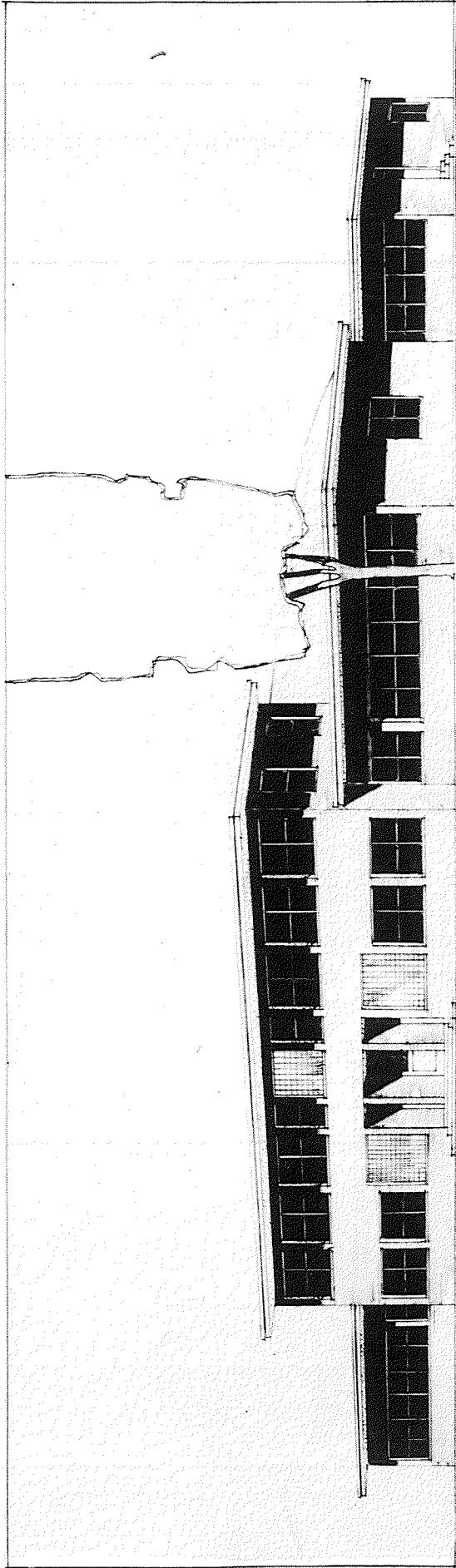

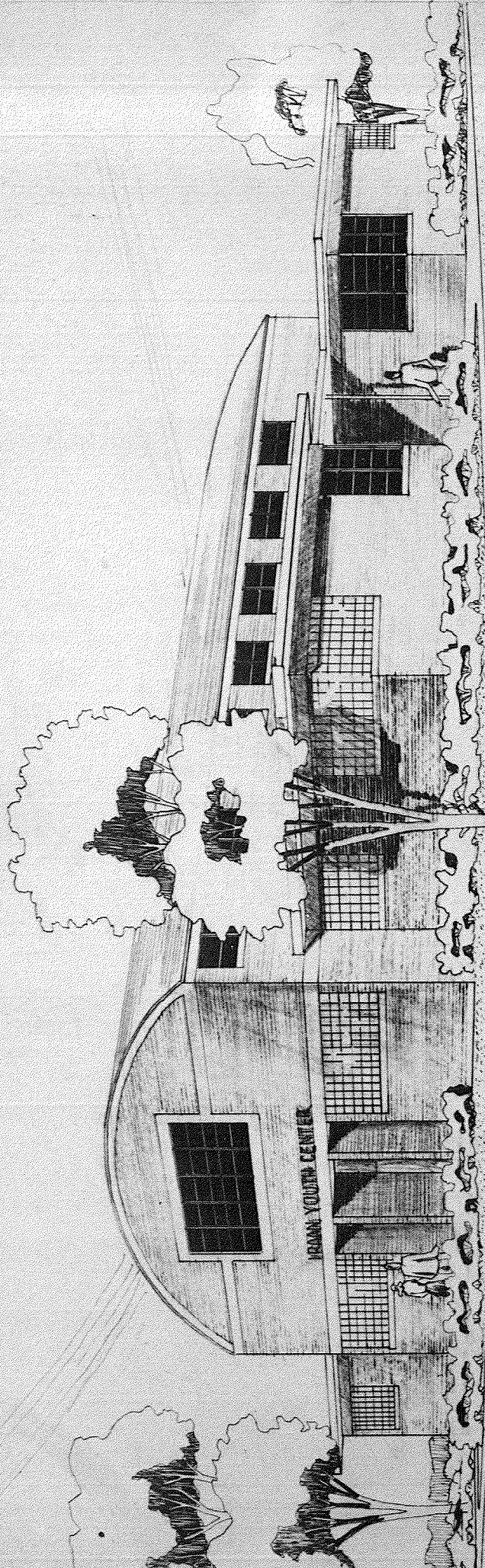




MCCAMEY PARK BUILDING

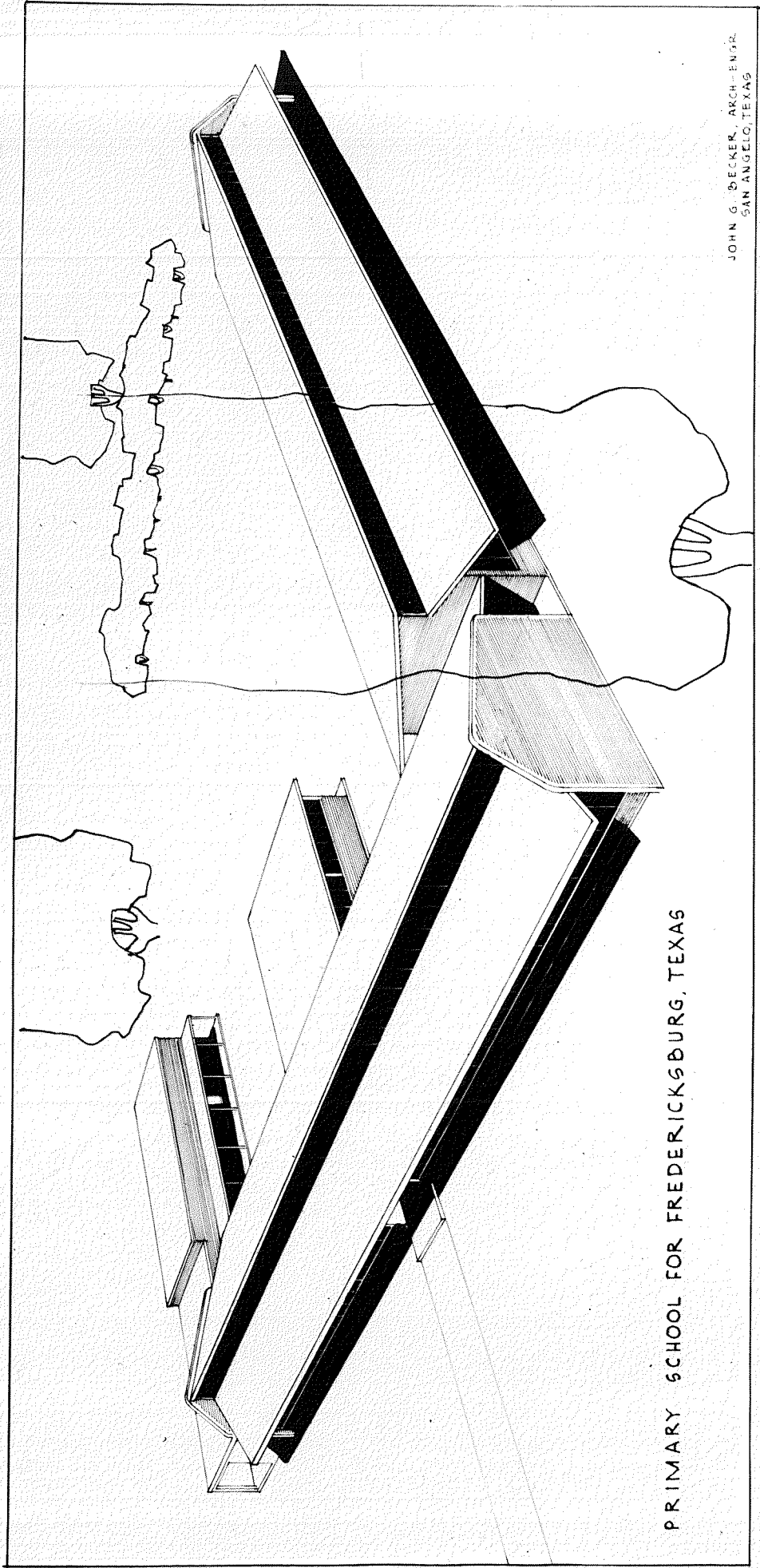

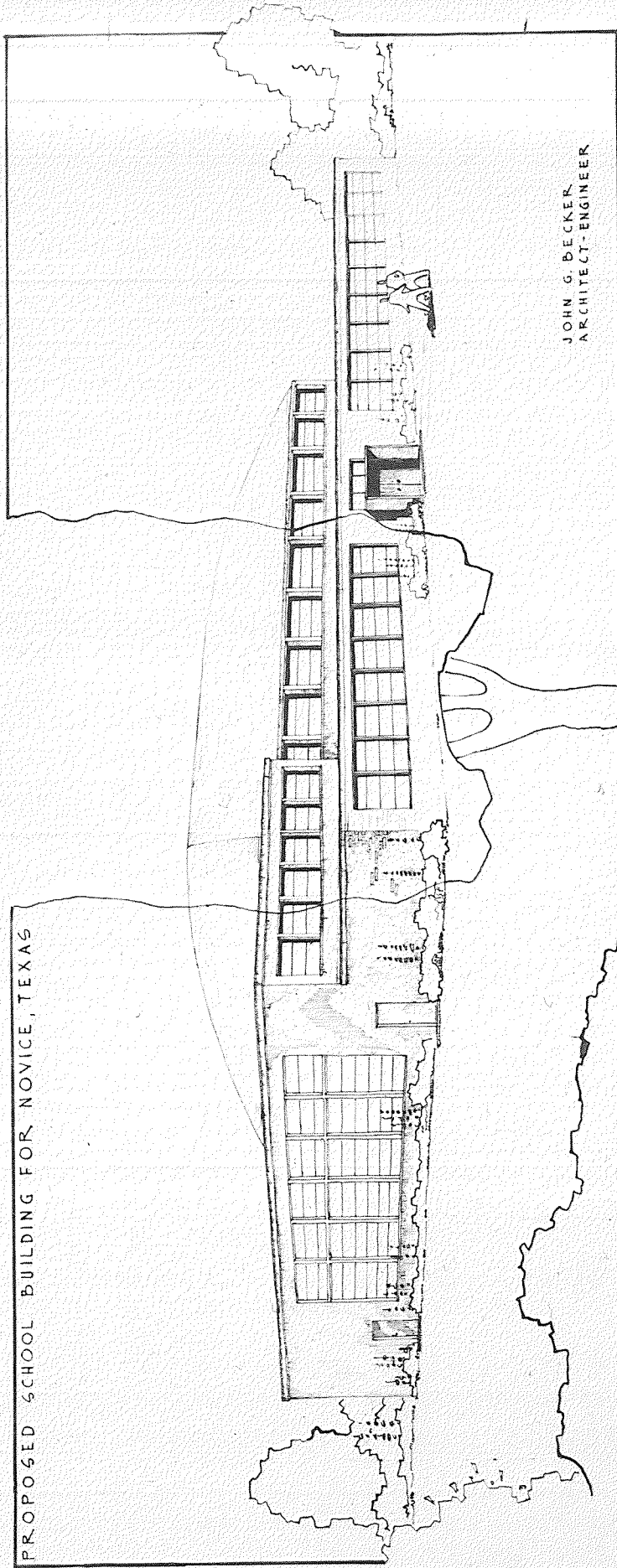




PRIMARY SCHOOL FOR FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS

PROPOSED SCHOOL BUILDING FOR NOVICE, TEXAS



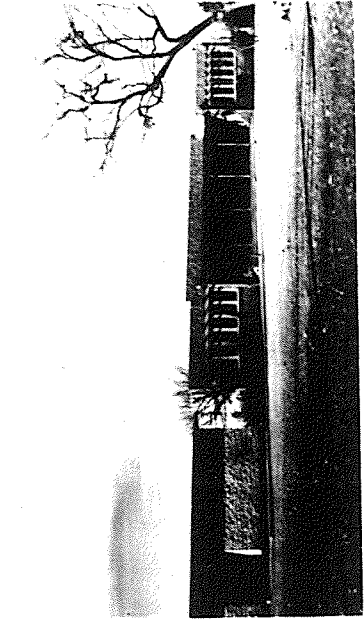

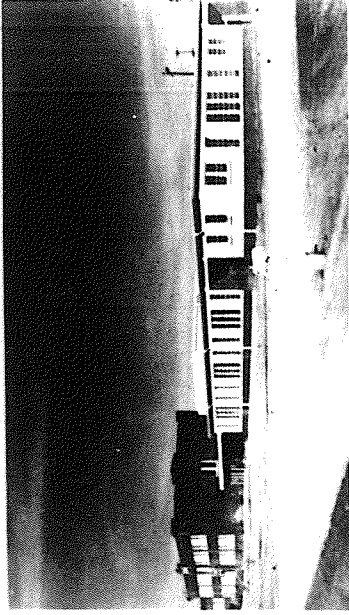




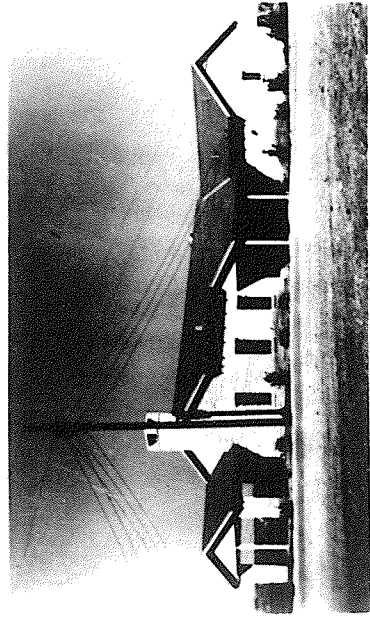
SAN ANGELO MUNICIPAL SWIMMING POOL  
1938 - OLYMPIC SIZE POOL - \$74,200



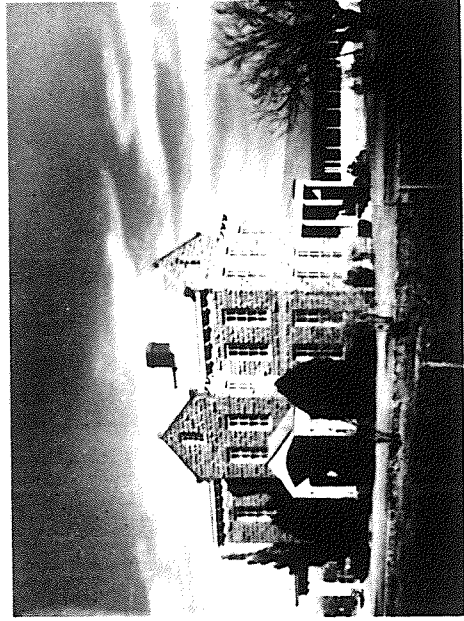
McGILL SCHOOL

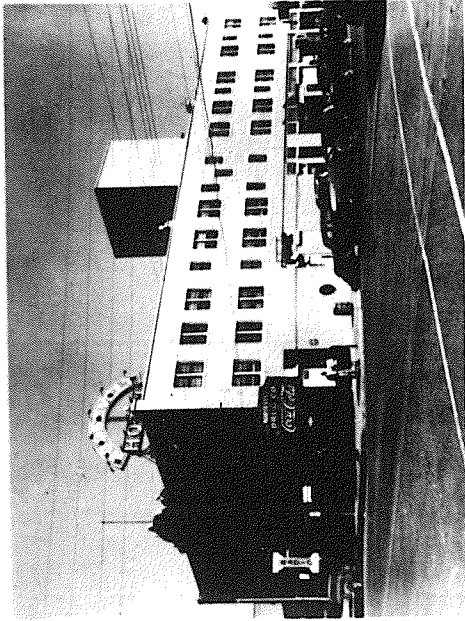


TOM GREEN COUNTY OLD AGE HOME SAN ANGELO, TEXAS  
1949 - 12 BED ADDITION \$15,470

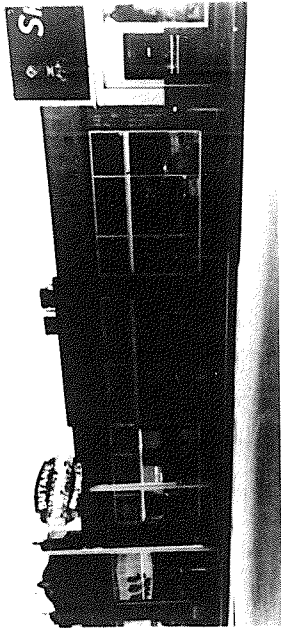


TOM GREEN COUNTY LIBRARY, SAN ANGELO, TEXAS

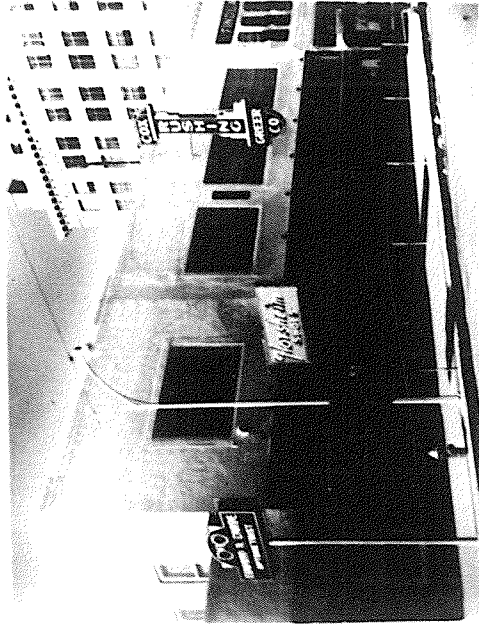




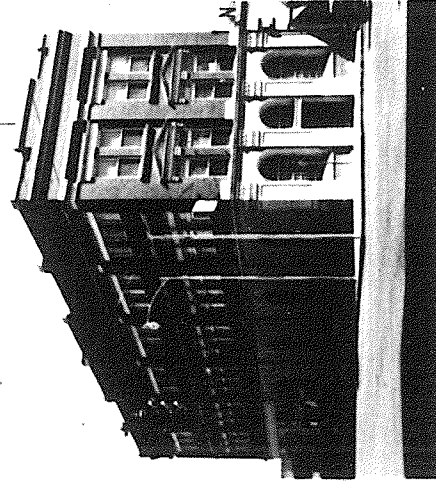
CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BUILDING  
1928 - 4 STORIES 84 ROOMS \$114,000



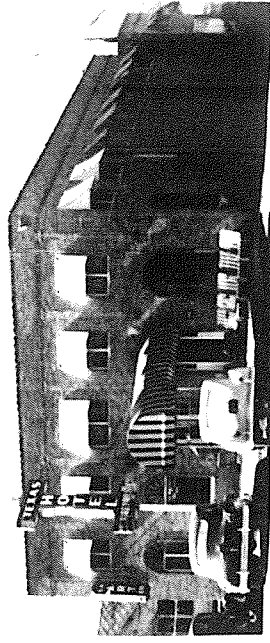

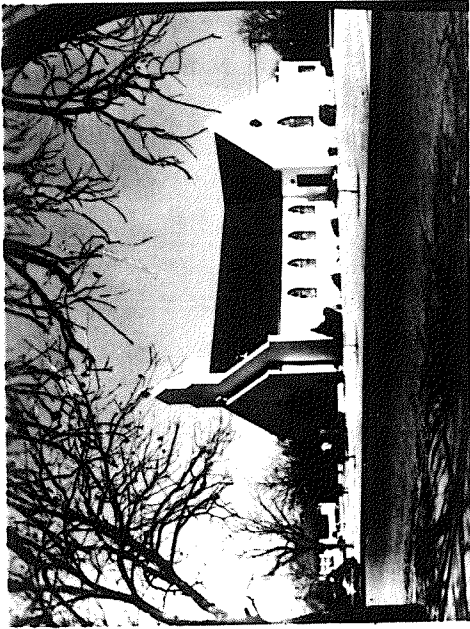

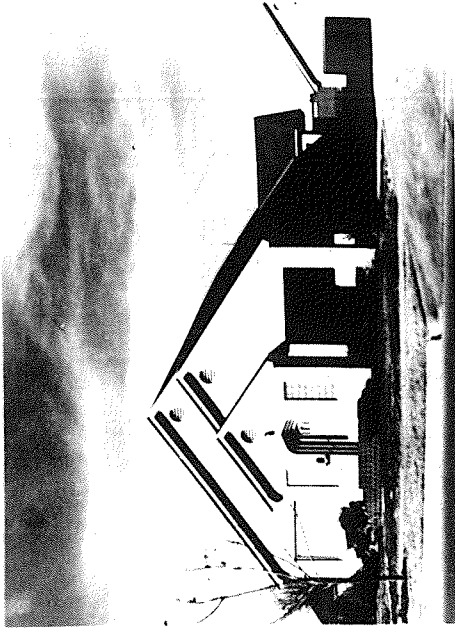

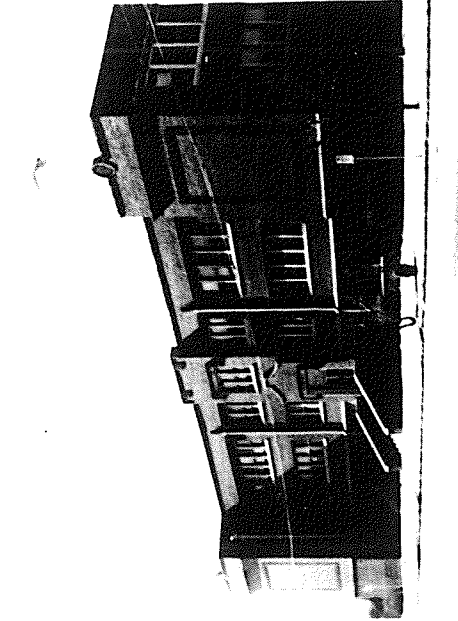

W. H. LANE RESIDENCE



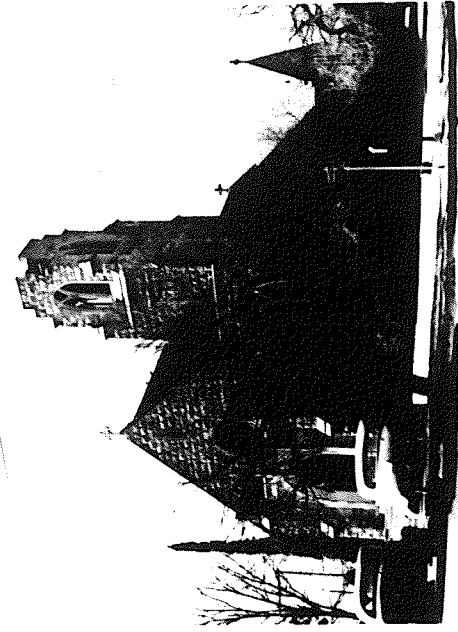
1950 - 40' X 100' - 125,448  
TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH



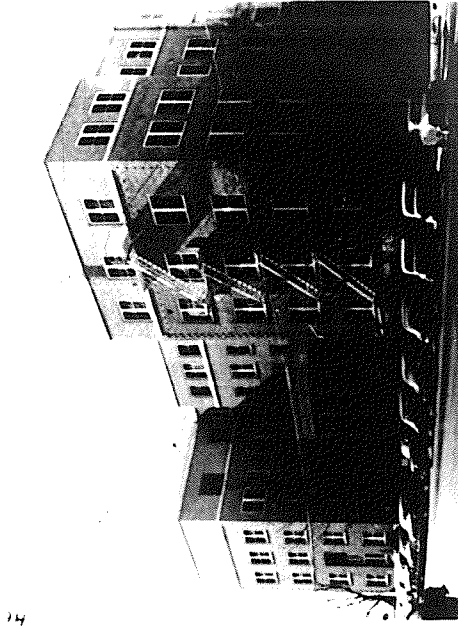
1947 - 9 ROOMS - 129,680
