We have received your letter dated November 2nd about the membership of Mr. Robert L. Bien, AIA.

If Mr. Bien is encountering temporary financial difficulty and wishes to remain in the AIA, he ought to write to the New York Chapter requesting it to consider recommending that his dues in arrears to National AIA be waived; or, if he is not practicing architecture at this time and does not wish to continue as a corporate member, he may still request that his dues be waived so that his resignation may be accepted without any outstanding dues owing the AIA and his Chapter.

We might add, for his information, that if he does not request special consideration through his Chapter, and if his membership is terminated for monpayment of 1967 dues, this will in no manner act as a barrier to his reapplication, should he ever reapply, except that the outstanding dues would be required upon reapplication.
