Dear Mr. Binda:

At the last meeting of the Board of Directors of the Detroit Chapter I was instructed to write you concerning a matter recently brought to the attention of the Board by the Office Practice Committee of the Western Michigan Chapter. This pertains to your financial interest and active participation in the Michigan Woodwork and Specialties Company of Battle Creek.

The Board of Directors of the Detroit Chapter would like to have your comments on this situation. In order that you may have some particular points on which to comment, here are the major charges that have been made.

- 1. That your activities as architect and part-owner of a contracting organization are incompatible and in violation of both the State Registration Act and the AIA Standards of Professional Fractice.
- That your access to the plans and specifications
  of other architects, while jobs are being bid,
  affords you an unfair advantage over these architects.
- 3. That as a result of No. 2 you have made use of other architects' details in your own work.
- 4. That in soliciting work you have promised concessions to the Owner in the form of free shelving, casework and millwork in order to secure the architectural commission.
- 5. That by retaining approval of subcontractors on your own jobs you have favored your mill.

- 6. That you have exerted pressure on the mill to give your jobs preferential treatment by scheduling them ahead of other prior jobs, selecting better woods, using better workmanship, etc.
- 7. That by being a member of the Detroit Chapter rather than the Western Michigan Chapter you have made it difficult for the latter to deal with the situation.

The Board is cognizant of the fact that in an Opinion dated April 22, 1960 (No. 2860), the Attorney General of the State of Michigan rulled that your part-ownership of Michigan Woodwork and Specialties Company did not contravene Act 240 (Registration Law).
