
A little more than a year ago I requested to be transferred from the Chicago Chapter of the AIA to the Mobile, Alabama Chapter because my principal interests are now located in that state.


Dear Miss Golato:

At the suggestion of Mr. Cary, member of the Mobile Chapter, am writing to you. On August 15, I wrote a letter to the A. I. A. in regard to status of my membership and also inquiring if the Journal was still extant.

I learned the reason for not receiving communications from the A. I. A. following our year abroad, which could be attributed to the delinquency of the Greek Postal Dept in not forwarding mail. Under the Papandreas regime the Postal Dept. deteriorated substantially during our stay in Greece, and thereafter until the new Government took over. Since then the service has been better.

I have received back copies of the Journal as requested.

In my letter of Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> I mentioned that I had been a corporate member since 1924 as noted in Annuary, close to 45 years. Perhaps you can answer my inquiry as to when relief can be expected in regard to dues which I have been paying over the years.
