Dear Mr. Bordeaux:

This will acknowledge your letter of November 19, at hand on the 22nd, enclosing page from The Journal of The Florida Education Association containing a card, in the nature of an advertisement, by Mr. L. Alex Hatton, A.I.A.

Is it your intention to formally file charges of unprofessional conduct against Mr. Hatton because of the insertion of this card? If so, your letter will be submitted to The Judiciary Committee of the A.I.A. - for completion of the required procedure.

In connection with this inquiry as to your intention, it is appropriate to say that the present Standards of Professional Practice (copy enclosed) is now under review by a special committee appointed by The Board - in view of widespread criticism within the membership of certain provisions of the current document - particularly, section 7, which reads in part "An architect shall avoid exaggerated, misleading or paid publicity." It may be that The Board of Directors will recommend some revisions of the current Standards of Professional Practice to the 1949 Convention, and its recommendations may have some bearing on the section above quoted.

However, that section is now in effect and should you desire to make a formal charge under it, please so advise. In order that you may have full information with regard to disciplinary procedure, a reprint containing all relevant provisions of the By-laws and rules of The Board of Directors is enclosed.

Please accept this letter as in no sense an effort to prejudice your action, and we shall be governed entirely by your response.


