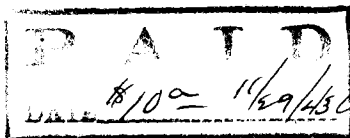





Architect Fills Planning Post

John Bozalis, architect, Tuesday was named by Mayor Street to replace Irvin Hurst on the city planning commission April 1.

Hurst, chairman of the commission, resigned last week after a commission recommendation to extend light industrial zoning eastward through the Harn tract to N Walnut, stirred up a city council dispute.

Hurst has been serving as executive secretary of the state capitol planning commission and as a member of the medical center planning board, both state agencies, as well as chairman of the city planning commission.

His eligibility to serve on both state and city boards was challenged by Bob Constant, ward two, who secured a city attorney's opinion holding it was a violation of the city charter and state laws.

A show-down on the Harn tract zoning was delayed for another week after councilmen agreed to reconsider a 4-3 vote which fell one vote short of the required number to grant the zoning.

Zoning of the tract is being sought as a site for the proposed \$750,000 Sears, Roebuck & Co. warehouse.
