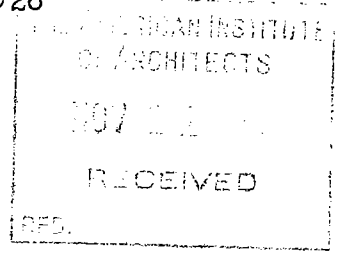

Dear Mr. Borie:

Responding to your confidential letter of November 10th, we have at hand the following information about Mr. Harry Barton, of Greensboro, N. C.:

He was admitted to the Institute in 1922. While his application was pending there were several privileged communications against him. These appeared to be from architects who had failed to pass the examinations of the State Board of North Carolina. Mr. Barton was then, and still is Secretary to the State Board of Examination and Registration of North Carolina.

The charges of unfairness were investigated by Mr. Kohn, acting for the Board; and he recommended that Mr. Barton be elected.

It appears from his application that he is a graduate in architecture of George Washington University, and in 1921 had been in practice fourteen years. For collegiate and office training he stated as follows: "Williamson School, George Washington University, Society of Beaux Arts Architects, and important northern architects' offices."

I judge that this data is incomplete for your purpose, so I have written a confidential letter to a well-informed Institute member, who is quite familiar with conditions of practice in North and South Carolina, who undoubtedly will respond with definite information. I shall advise you as soon as reply is received.

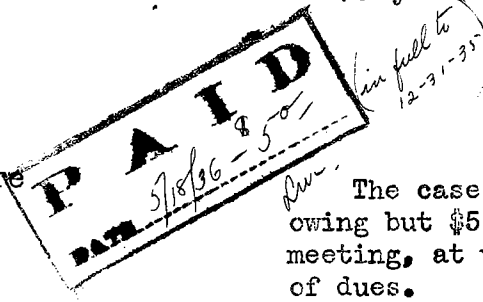
