Dear Mr. Brown:

This is in response to the footnote attached to the letter you received from Washington National Insurance Company, dated August 22, 1963.

Unfortunately, the agreement the insurance company had was that it would insure all applicants if 50% or more of the membership made application for this insurance. This turned out to be far from the actual situation, and only a relatively small percentage had taken out this coverage. Therefore, in order to protect itself against what the insurance people call "adverse selection," the company has had to "rate" the policies through its underwriting department and issue coverage only to those who present normal risks.

We are very sorry that this situation has occurred, but there is nothing we know which can be done about it.

If you have any questions on the matter, I shall be happy to try to answer them.
