### HISTORY OF FIRM

The firm of Britsch & Munger, Registered Architects, Toledo, Ohio, was established as a partnership in 1927. They are recognized as among the leading architects in this section of the country.

The members of the firm are graduates of well recognized schools of architectural design and engineering. See pages 11-12-13-14-15-16-17-18-19-20 and 21. Before forming the partnership each had twelve to fifteen years of experience in well known architects' offices and in the supervision of public works.

With the exception of the national depression years, each year has seen a steady growth of this firm and greater recognition accorded them for the results attained and the efficient manner in which they handled the projects awarded to them.

Toledo's Zow Cost Housing and Slum Clearance movement was started in 1933 by Britsch & Munger and carried along by them to fruition at their own expense. Brand Whitlock Homes, Charles F. Weiler Homes and a later addition to Brand Whitlock Homes, a total housing for over 1000 families was designed and supervised by them. Much work has recently been done on design and drawings for a 450 family housing project for the Toledo Metropolitan Housing Authority, which project is delayed. The Federal Public Housing Authority commissioned Britsch & Munger to design and supervise eighteen war housing projects.

A score or more of Northwestern Ohio schools have been designed by Britsch & Munger - among them being Maumee. Wauseon, Sylvania, Perrysburg, Delta and Pemberville High Schools, and Elementary Schools at Pemberville, Montpelier, Wauseon, Holland, Edon and Archbold, Ohio.

This firm acted as architectural consultants for the officials of the Toledo Museum of Art when the \$2,000,000.00 addition was built in 1929 and 1930.

### **BRITSCH & MUNGER**

Much of Britsch & Munger's recent work has been along industrial lines. A \$200,000.00 addition to the Plant of the Toledo Machine & Tool Branch of E. W. Blise Company was designed and supervised by this firm. This firm aided the Electric Auto-Lite Company of Toledo in the design and construction of a large addition to their plant at LaCrosse, Wisconsin. Large new additions to the plants of the Peters Stamping Company, Perrysburg, Ohio, Grizzly Manufacturing Company, Paulding, Ohio and Aro Equipment Cerporation, Bryan, Ohio, have been designed and supervised by them. A new Power Plant and addition to the Tecumseh Products Company Plant at Tecumseh, Michigan is among their recent work.

A large Engineer Depot for the U.S. Army at Marion, Ohio was designed by Britsch & Munger and constructed under their supervision. Scores of architects, civil, mechanical and electrical engineers as well as surveyors and site planners were employed by them on this \$5,000,000.00 project. This project consists of more than one million square feet of open sheds, more than 20 miles of railroad, many miles of concrete streets, water lines, wells, pumping plant, reservoirs, water tower, fire pumps, sewers and sewage disposal plant, yard and inside lighting, power lines, fire station and fire fighting equipment, administration building, officers' quarters, and many acres of paved storage area.

As of January the first M. DeWitt Grow, who has been connected with the firm in the capacity of chief draftsman and designer since his graduation from Carnegie Institute of Technology in 1931, has been admitted to the firm as junior partner.

All of the key men in the organization are either registered architects of registered engineers or both, and numbered in the force are graduates of such well known schools as Carnegie Institute of Technology, University of Notre Dame, Ohio State University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, University of Michigan and University of Toledo.

Associated with Britsch & Munger as supervisor of construction and specification writer is John P. Macelwane, Registered Architect and Engineer.

Mark B. Stophlet, formerly a partner in Stophlet & Stophlet well known practicing architects of many years standing, is also associated with the firm. He designed and supervised Lucas County Hospital one of Toledo's largest hospitals.

Within Britsch & Munger's force is contained the knowledge and experience to handle any architectural, mechanical and structural problem required. However, it has been their practice to call on specialists, where such services may be beneficial to the job.

- R. C. Reese, structural engineer of Toledo, has been their consulting structural engineer for many years. Mr. Reese has had unusual and extensive experience and has a national reputation in his field.
- S. D. Bryce of their force designed the mechanical work on Britsch & Munger's large P.W.A. School program.

John Paul Jones, Cary & Miller, Mechanical Engineers of Cleveland, Ohio, served as their consulting mechanical engineers on low cost housing projects.

Collaborating also, when required, is the firm of Finkbeiner, Pettis & Strout, Consulting Engineers, specialists on water supply, paving and rail-roads. This firm assisted on the Marion Quartermaster Depot.

Gerald Barton of Toledo with a large force of surveyors collaborates with Britisch & Munger to round out the complete architectural and engineering service furnished by them.

Al. G. Britsch of Britsch & Munger's force is a well known Toledo

Landscape Architect and Site Planner. He served in that capacity on Charles F.

Weiler Homes and Brand Whitlock Homes addition in Toledo.

Offices of Britsch & Munger are located at 531 Nicholas Building, Toledo 4, Ohio.

# HISTORY OF FIRM (Finkbeiner, Pettis & Strout)

This engineering organization was founded in 1900 by the late George Champe, (deceased 1937) and until 1910 its principal practice was devoted to electric railroad location and construction and the design and supervision of construction of pavements and sewers in Ohio, Michigan and Indiana. The advance of the carriers into the outlying cities and towns created a tremendous demand for hard surfaced pavements and sewers and ushered in the period of original waterworks construction and improvement which continued until about 1920.

In 1922, Carleton S. Finkbeiner joined the staff as an assistant engineer after having acted as pavement construction inspector during intermittent periods in 1920 and 1921. In 1926, the organization name was revised to George Champe and Associates. In 1936, George Champe and Carleton Finkbeiner formed a partnership under the firm name of Champe, Finkbeiner and Associates, this name being continued after the death of Mr. Champe on August 22, 1937. C. E. Pettis and Harold K. Strout became identified with the organization in 1933 and 1937 respectively and were admitted to junior partnership on January 1, 1940.

On January 1, 1942, the organization name was revised to Finkbeiner, Pettis and Strout.

Since 1922, the principal practice of the firm has been devoted to the design and supervision of water supply, water treatment, sewerage, sewage treatment, waste treatment and appraisals. However, since that date, projects involving railroad location and construction, hydroelectric developments, steam and diesel engine generation, electric distribution, airports and ordnance production have been handled.
