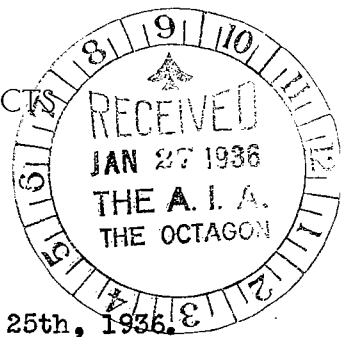


The enclosed copy of letter of January 19, 1937 to Mr. Buckler is self-explanatory, but no further action by him appears in the matter.

Dear Mr. Fenhagen:

Please correct my letter to you of March 24 with regard to the possible application for reinstatement of Mr. Riggin Buckler, as follows:

The third paragraph should read -

"If he applies for reinstatement before June 30, 1942 the cost would be \$5.00 for the readmission fee and \$20.00 for dues for the ensuing twelve months after re-election."

In other words, the dues which must be paid at the time of applying for readmission are the current Institute dues of \$20.00 - and not \$5.00 is stated previously.

Newly elected members are required to pay only \$5.00 for the first year's dues; \$10.00 for the second year's dues; etc.; but the by-laws specifically prohibit this reduction of dues for former Institute members.

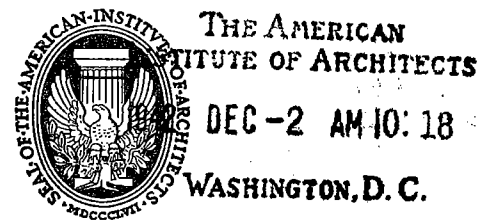
