I have not had many large commissions as I have not gone after them very strenuously and have not gone in for political jobs, or rather political hand-outs. Schools have been my largest commissions. The largest was at Chicora, S. C. costing about \$42,000.00 and a later addition to the building costing about \$56,000.00. Built a \$28,000.00 school at Midland Park, S. C. and an addition to Ladson, S. C. School costing \$25,000.00 for the same school board. As head of the architectural squad at the Navy Yard, Charleston, S. C. had charge of design of Naval Hospital.
