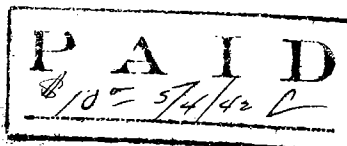

Following is a direct quote from a lead article on Churches published in the December 1953 issue of Architectural Forum:

"Until very recently the creed of modern architecture has received only lip service in most U.S. church design. There has been substantial reason for this, the usual one, the clients. The congregation are the Medici of this age, and most of them have been very undecided about architecture; they are likely to hide on Sunday morning behind sentimental images from the past.

But today it is possible to see the beginning of an encouraging strength in U.S. church design. There is a new affirmation and confidence in recent designs. As in the serenely welcoming facade of the Ohio church illustrated (St. Stephen's Church, Columbus, Ohio) there is a poised expression of a real faith for our times."

An additional quote by Pietro Belluschi, author of a career pamphlet "Should Your Child Be An Architect?" follows:

"St. Stephen's Church in Columbus, Ohio, illustrates the desire of today's architects to depart from the older, traditional types of church architecture and to strive for greater simplicity through the sensitive use of modern materials."

St. Stephen's Church in Columbus, Ohio, by Brooks and Coddington, completed in 1954, serves as an outstanding contribution to the contemporary architecture of the present era, and is a fine example of the careful, precise and thoughtful architectural design so typical of this office.

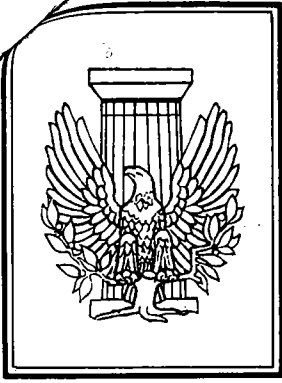
In acknowledgment of his creative genius and renown in the field of architecture, and his citations for outstanding contributions to church architecture, his contributions to the field of engineering education, and his leadership in the affairs of his profession, the faculty of the College of Engineering takes pride in designating *Gilbert H. Coddington* a "Distinguished Alumnus."



Gilbert H. Coddington received both the Bachelor of Architectural Engineering and the Bachelor of Architecture degrees in 1931 from The Ohio State University. While holding the Lake Forest Fellowship, he continued graduate studies and received the Master of Science degree in Architecture from Columbia University in 1932. He was awarded the Tau Beta Pi Fellowship for advanced study and foreign travel in 1932. In 1935, he again traveled and studied architecture in England, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany. During his career Mr. Coddington was associated with the architectural firms of Pettit and Oman, T. W. Brooks, Ernest Grunsfeld, L. Morgan Yost, and Dan Carmichael. He also served as an assistant professor of engineering drawing at The Ohio State University for several years. In 1946 he organized the present firm of Brooks and Coddington, Architects. The firm has designed residential, commercial, industrial, and monumental architecture, including the U. S. Gypsum Research Village House at Barrington Woods, Illinois, and the Climate Control Residence, Columbus, Ohio, for the *House Beautiful* Climate-Control Project. For his creative design of St. Stephens Episcopal Church, Columbus, Ohio, Mr. Coddington was awarded a special citation by the Commission on Architecture of the National Council of Churches, rating it as one of the 18 outstanding church buildings constructed in the last 25 years. Reporting this citation, the *Architectural Forum* observed, "Until very recently the creed of modern architecture has received only lip service in most U. 
