


The above records were considered as the equivalent of graduation by the State Boards of New York and New Jersey.







If you will send your check for the above amount, your application will be in due order, and it can then go forward. The Secretary assures you he will do everything he can to expedite its progress.





Gentlemen:

Earlier this year, I received a letter, suggesting that I apply for 'Emeritus Status', because of my disability, in advance of achieving the age of 70. At the time, the idea seemed ridiculous, in spite of my problems of 1970.

Since then, complications have developed, including two periods in the hospital and the prospect of surgery followed by extensive plastic repair work during the next few months. In the meantime, I have received a commission, but, due to my ambulatory problems, it has been necessary to 'farm out' the architectural work, as well as the engineering, and I hope that I shall break even. Currently I am at the point of some dependence on Social Security, Medicare and with some questions, due to an approaching birthday, my CNA/Insurance.

So, I wish, if possible, to retract my impulsive rejection of the suggested application for Emeritus Status, with the hopes that it may be applied for now and be retroactive, because of the unexpected developments.

retired architect whose projects included the landscaping of the Iwo Jima Memorial and the renovation of St. John's Episcopal Church, Lafayette Square, died of an aneurysm Dec. 26 at Alexandria Hospital.

Mr. Cole, who lived in Alexandria, was born in Asbury Park, N.J. He attended Princeton University and took a degree in architecture at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He also studied at the Ecole des Beaux Arts in France.

He moved to the Washington area in 1943 and during World War II worked for the War Production Board and the Reconstruction Finance Corp. In the late 1940s, he established a private practice in architecture and was a partner in the firm of Cole & Peaslee. He retired in 1978 for reasons of health.

In the course of his career, Mr. Cole was in charge of the restoration of the Cosmos Club in Washington, of which he was a member, and the Presbyterian Meeting House in Alexandria. He was a consultant to the Fine Arts Commission.
