Frank William Cole, 82, le retired architect whose projects included the landscaping of the Iwo Jima Memorial and the renovation of St. John's Episcopal Church, Lafayette Square, died of an aneurysm Dec. 26 at Alexandria Hospital. Mr. Cole, who lived in Alexandria, was born in Asbury Park, N.J. He attended Princeton University and took a degree in architecture at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He also studied at the Ecole des Beaux Arts in France. He moved to the Washington area in 1943 and during World War II worked for the War Production Board and the Reconstruction Finance Corp. In the late 1940s, he Sestablished a private practice in architecture and was a partner in the firm of Cole & Peaslee. He retired in n 1978 for reasons of health.
