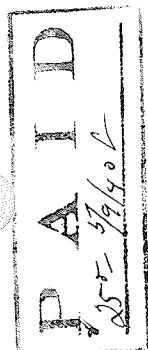

In answer to your letter of May 13, 1940 I am sending herewith, two photographs of buildings to accompany my application for membership. I am happy to say that my excuse for the long delay is that I was just too busy to think about it! I put the letter in a basket when it arrived, and have just now gotten around to clearing out the basket.

A great deal of my work has been in collaboration with Mr. Slifer, who, incidently was a member of the Institute for a good many years, but I have picked these two jobs, not because they are the best, but because I handled them entirely by myself from start to finish. The first is a Field House for Hamline University, St. Paul, Minn. done in 1936 at a cost of approximately \$100,000.00. The second is St. Mary's R. C. Church at Winnebago, Minn. done in 1938 at a cost of \$30,000.00.
