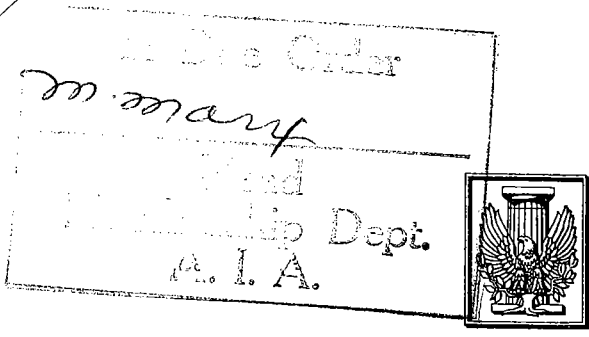




Dear Sirs,
