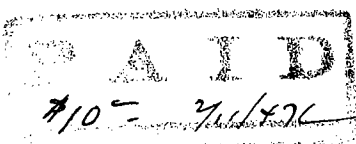

**PETER COPELAND, 70,
A STORES ARCHITECT**

Peter Copeland, an industrial architect, died Wednesday at New York Hospital. He was 70 years old and lived in Manhattan and in East Hampton, L.I.

With Adolph Novak, Mr. Copeland was the founder in 1952 of Copeland, Novak & Associates, now Copeland, Novak & Israel, with Lawrence J. Israel.

The concern specialized over the years in commercial development and shopping-center designs in suburban areas. One such, in the early nineteen-fifties, was the Hempstead, L.I., unit of Abraham & Straus, the Brooklyn department store. It was ultramodern in design, with two stories and a basement, designed to permit the addition of two more floors.

In 1936, Mr. Copeland won a \$750 second prize, the highest given, for the design of a typical building for the New York World's Fair of 1939-40.

Mr. Copeland graduated from the New York University School of Architecture.

His widow, the former Esther Hoffman, and two daughters, Julie and Maura, survive.
