Peter Copeland, an industrial architect, died Wednesday at New York Hospital. He was 70 years old and lived in Man-hattan and in East Hampton,

With Adolph Novak, Mr. Copeland was the founder in 1952 of Copeland, Novak & Associates, now Copeland, Novak & Israel, with Lawrence J. Israel.

The concern specialized over the years in commercial development and shopping-center designs in suburban areas. One such, in the early nineteen-fifties, was the Hempstead, L.I., unit of Abraham & Straus, the Brooklyn department store. It was ultramodern in design, with two stories and a basement, designed to permit the addition of two more floors.

In 1936, Mr. Copeland won a \$750 second prize, the highest given, for the design of a typical building for the New York World's Fair of 1939-40.

Mr. Copeland graduated from the New York University School of Architecture.

His widow, the former Esther Hoffman, and two development.
