Dear Mr. Corbett:

This is in reply to your letter of January 22 and has further reference to your letter of December 8 and our response of December 22. We are returning our letter of December 22 and The Institute's statement in the amount of \$35.00 for your records, as requested.

The following is the situation in regard to chapter and Institute dues:

The American Institute of Architects has annual dues for new members in the amount of \$5.00 for the first year; \$10.00 for the second year; \$15.00 for the third year; and \$20.00 for the fourth year. Thereafter, dues are \$25.00 per year, or as set by Convention or Board action.

Every member of The Institute must belong to a particular chapter to which he is assigned when he becomes a member, or to which he is subsequently transferred. (Our records indicate that you are assigned to the Northern California Chapter.) Chapters have separate dues, and these vary widely in amount, in some cases being less than Institute dues and in other cases being far higher.

Your 1948 Institute dues were \$15.00; your 1949 Institute dues are \$20.00. This makes a total of \$35.00 owing to The Institute.

You state that you sent your check No. 2199 in the amount of \$25.00 and you thought you had sent it to The Institute. We believe it is entirely possible that you sent this \$25.00 check to your Chapter and that the check was either mislaid by the Chapter, or cashed by it as payment of your Chapter dues.

In any event, The Institute does not have a record of having received any amount in payment for your 1948 or 1949 dues.

We hope that this will clear the matter; and, if you have any other questions, please feel free to write to us again. Or perhaps you would like to contact the Secretary of the Northern California Chapter, Mr. Ralph N. Pollack, 369 Pine Street, San Francisco 4, California.


