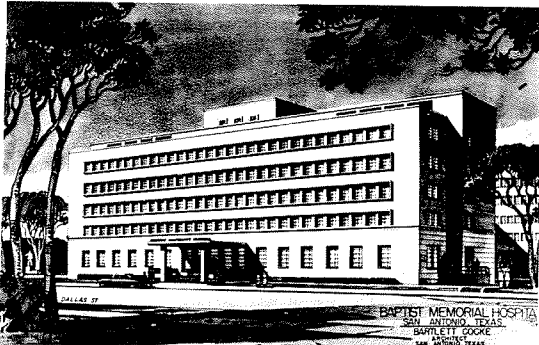
SOUTH ELEVATION

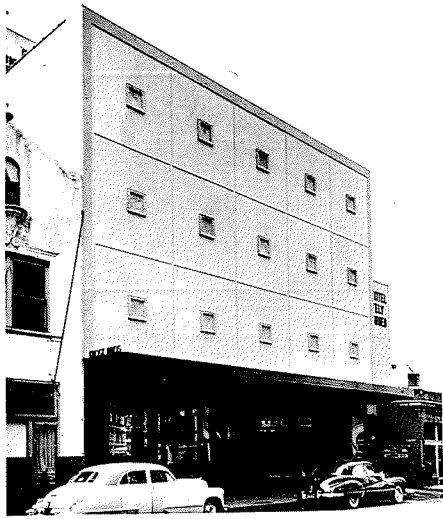
