



Deer Mr. delappe:

Your letter of March 29th with enclosure is at hand. I am referring your letter to Mr. William Stanley Perker, Consultant to our Committee on Office Practice, as a number of the questions would appear to fall within his jurisdiction.

In the meantime, I will comment on such of the questions contained on the "Questions for Architects of the Yuba School District" which I think may come within my purview:

- 1. I think this is the exchitect's determination. However, Mr. Parker may want to comment.
- 2. and 3. Those are purely statistical enswers which the architect can supply.
- 4. An exchitect would be most ill-advised to agree to any such stipulation.
- 5, 6, 7. These are answers only the architect can give.
- 8. Would depend on the ensuer to 7, but I think any architect would have a good ensuer to this.
- 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16. The answers to these questions can only be supplied by the architect concerned.

Although Mr. Perker may wish to comment, on the whole I do not see anything particularly out of order with the questions raised by the School District, though obviously they should be answered with a good deal of care by the architects and with a special eye to the emplications of the questions and answere.

I recall meeting you very pleasantly at Hoberg's and trust I will see you next autumn at Santa Barbara.
