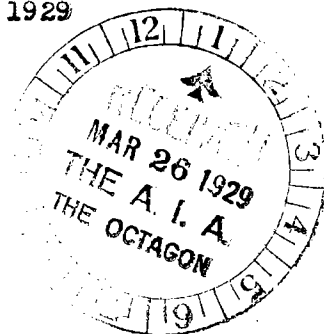

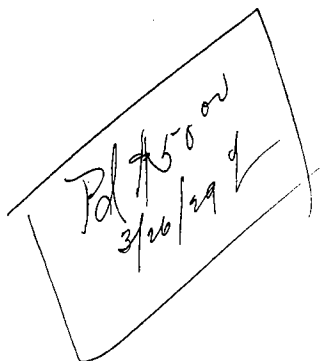

# **DELEHANTY, 77, DIES; AN ARCHITECT HERE**

CLEVELAND, June 8—Bradley Delehanty, a New York architect, died here Tuesday at the home of a daughter, Mrs. John Hildt. His age was 77.

Mr. Delehanty, whose full name was John Washington Bradley Delehanty, had an office at 2 Park Avenue and his home was at 444 East 57th Street, New York. He also maintained a residence at 3 Locust Valley, L. I.

Last year Mr. Delehanty designed an interfaith chapel for C. W. Post College of Long Island University, to be erected at Greenvale, L. I.

Mr. Delehanty graduated in 1910 from Cornell University and attended the Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris. He belonged to the American Institute of Architects.

A keen horseman, he had been a noted steeplechaser and foxhunter. He also had served on executive committees of horse show on Long Island.

Besides his daughter he leaves a brother, three sisters, and five grandchildren.

There will be a mass for Mr. Delehanty at 11 A.M. Friday at the Roman Catholic Church of St. Vincent Ferrer, Lexington Avenue and 68th Street, New York.
