A receipt to cover the preliminary fee is enclosed herewith.

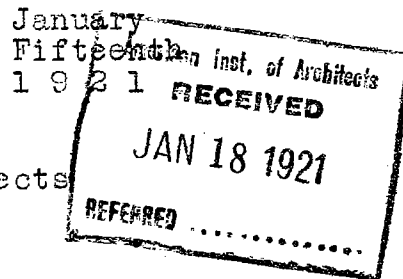

You will find enclosed a reproduction of a rendering by the writer of a dormitory building which we now have under construction at Conway, Ark.

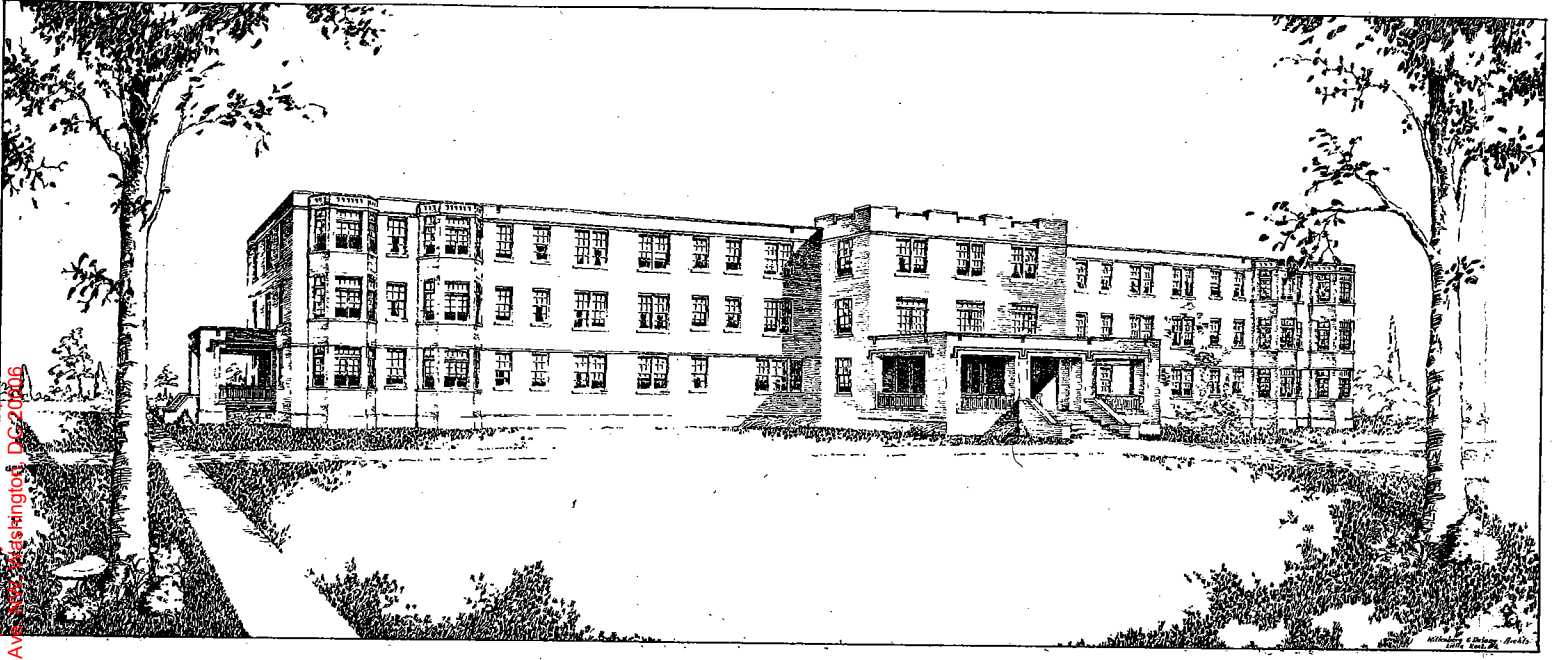

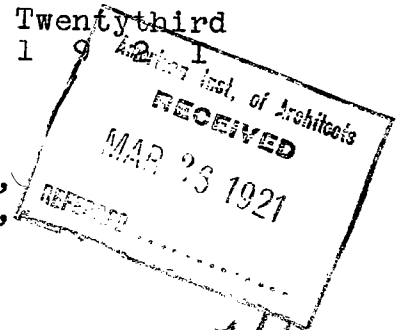

Gentlemen:

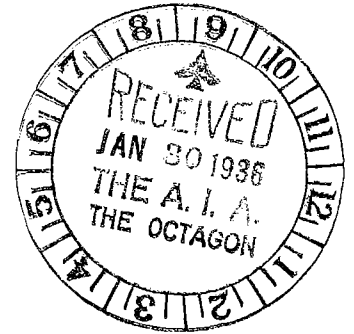
