



Paul d'Entremont

Paul d'Entremont, an architect who designed many public schools in Lower Bucks County, died Friday in Warminster General Hospital. He was 80.

Mr. d'Entremont was born in Pubnico, Nova Scotia, Canada, and was a longtime resident of Feasterville.

He received his education in the 1930s at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Evening School of Structural Engineering Design and at the T-Square Club of Philadelphia.

His designs were influenced by the teachings of Frank Lloyd Wright. He designed the Lower Southampton Elementary School in 1950, which won an award at the Philadelphia Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. For the next 20 years Mr. d'Entremont became the principal designer for area school districts. His designs include Council Rock High School, Council Rock Intermediate, Rolling Hill, Herbert Hoover, Tawanka Elementary, Carl Sandburg and Samuel Everett schools.

He won eight awards for school designs from the Philadelphia Chapter of the AIA. His design for Neshaminy Junior High School was accepted for an exhibit in Geneva, Switzerland.

In his later years, Mr. d'Entremont became a champion of solar design in association with his son, Peter. They received a Housing and Urban Development award for excellence in residential solar design in the 1970s.

Son of the late George D. and Monique Bellivau d'Entremont, he is survived by his wife, Grace E. Berst d'Entremont; his daughter, Nicole d'Entremont of Portland, Maine; three sons, Peter of Blue Hill, Maine; Marc of Jenkintown, and Phillip of Feasterville; one sister, Lucille Murphy of Rhode Island and six grandchildren.

A memorial service will be conducted at 2 p.m. Friday at the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church, Feasterville.
