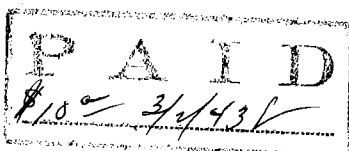

# Obituaries

## Millard Donaldson, architect, 88

Millard E. Donaldson, an architect who designed many area homes and such buildings as Cole Field House at the University of Maryland, died Monday after a long illness at his home in the 500 Mock of Sudbrook Lane in Sudbrook Park.

A memorial service will be held tomorrow at 10 a.m. at St. Mark's-on-the-Hill Episcopal Church, 1620 Reisterstown Road, Pikesville.

Mr. Donaldson, who was 88, retired 11 years ago after having practiced independently since 1963. For 20 years before that, he had been a partner in the firm of Border and Donaldson. Earlier, he had been associated with James R. Edmunds Jr., Lawrence Hall Fowler and the firm of Palmer and Lambdin.

His specialty was Georgian architecture.

Early in his career, he designed many homes in Guilford and Homeland. His designs also included the

Hall of Records in Annapolis, Cole Field House and mathematics and science buildings at the University of Maryland, a science building at Morgan State University, the Baltimore Federal Building, a church, convent and school for St. Mark's Parish in Catonsville, the Martin Spaulding High School and other schools and hospitals in several states.

He is survived by his wife, the former Melissa Pyle; a daughter, Carol Waggoner of Pickens, W.Va.; a stepson, S. Rogers Mann of Glyndon; three grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

The family suggested that donations be made to the memorial fund of St. Mark's-on-the-Hill Church.
