## Drayer to Design Chatsworth Project

Donald Hudson Drayer, Washington architect, has been selected to design Chatsworth, an 80-townhouse project to be built in Chevy Chase by the Great Universal Development Co., Inc., of New York, it has been announced.

Chatsworth will be located on the Bonnie Brae estate, which was sought several years ago by the Russians to be used as a chancellery. The property also was considered briefly as a possible residence for the vice president.

Drayer has designed a number of luxury apartments in the Washington area, including Grosvenor Park Apartments in Rockville, and the 1,000-unit apartment project now under construction at Pooks Hill in Bethesda.

Donald Hudson Drayer, 64, an architect in this area since 1934, died at his home Sunday after a long illness. He lived on Hillyer Place NW. *4/22/73*

A graduate of Washington University at St. Louis, Mr. Drayer worked as an architect for the Public Buildings Administration and the Navy Department during the Depression and World War II. He left the Navy Department in 1947 to enter into private practice.

Mr. Drayer designed several area highrise apartments including Grosvenor Park, Prospect House, The Colonnade, the Landow Building, as well as many private residences.

He leaves his wife, Maria Romona; his mother, Mrs. F. H. Drayer of Santa Cruz, Calif.; a brother, William of Santa Cruz; three daughters, Mrs. Anne Hasle of Middletown, Md., Mrs. Mary Lome of Chicago, and Carolyn Drayer of Benzonia, Mich.; a son, Peter of Jefferson, Va.; and 11 grandchildren.
