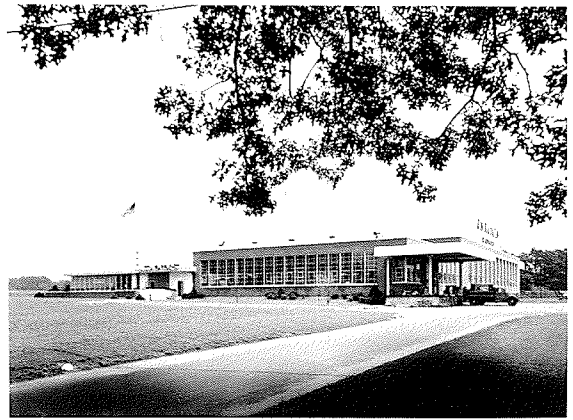

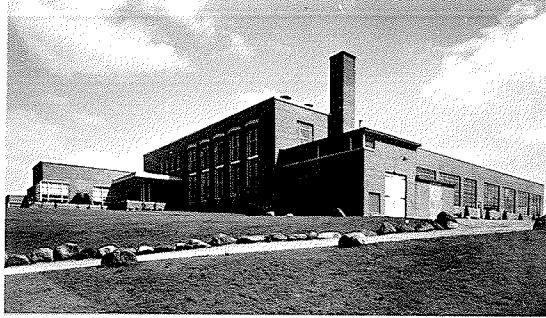

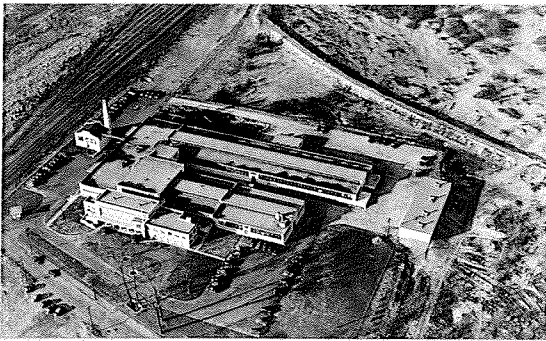

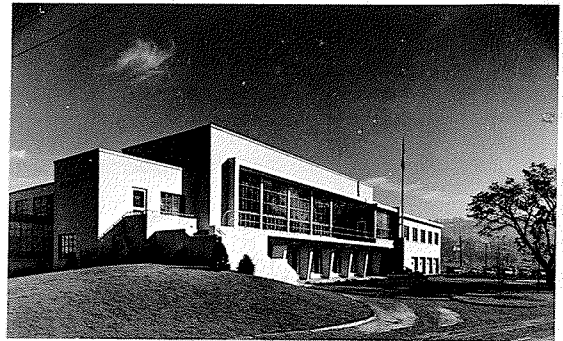

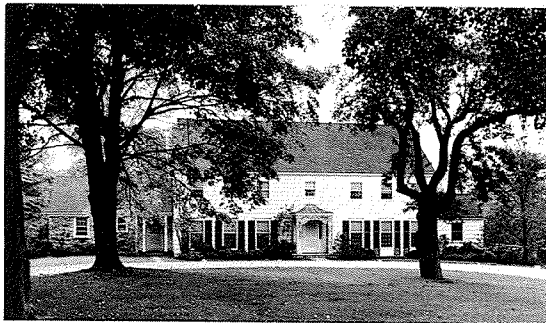
PERSPECTIVE VIEW, OFFICE & SHOP, FAIRFIELD, CONN.

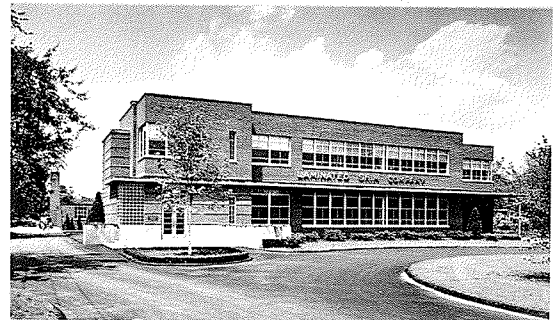

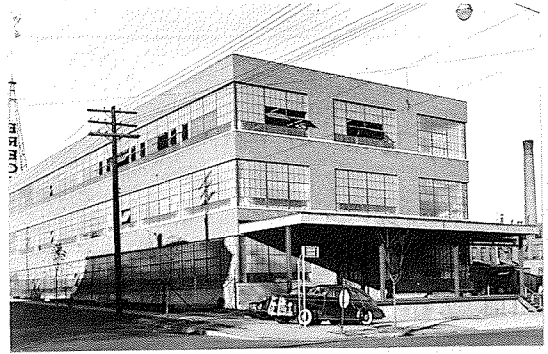

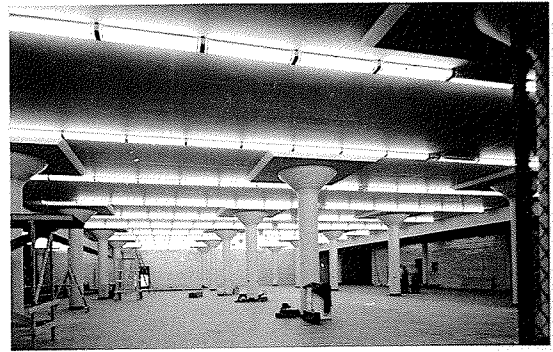

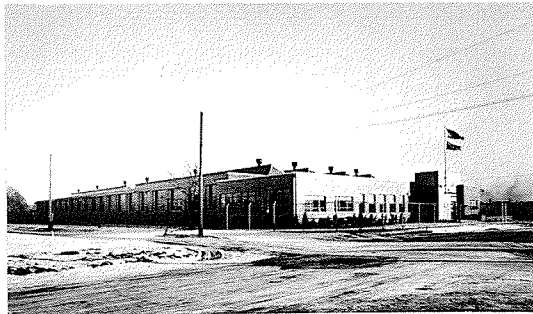
FRONT CORNER, "ERECTOR" FACTORY, NEW HAVEN, CT.

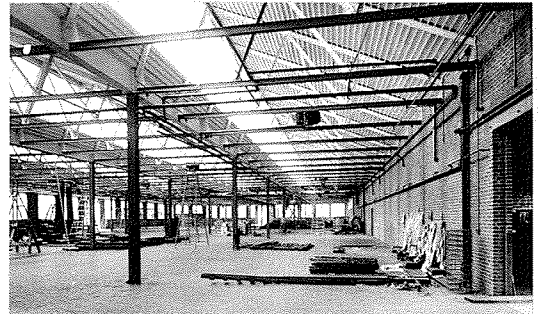
