The Institute's committee structure has become so cumbersome and complicated that not only were we functioning inefficiently but also the financial burden of supporting the committees prevented us from engaging in other needed services to the members. The Board therefore had a study made for the purpose of streamlining our organization. This study recommeded a number of changes which have been put into effect. These changes included the abolishment of some committees and reductions in personnel in others.

The Committee on Hospitals and Health has now become a standing vertical committee of only five members. The reduction naturally entails disappointment to those loyal and devoted members who have not been designated to continue on the committee. Personnel decisions were difficult in the extreme, as virtually without exception all members of committees have made substantial contributions to the welfare of the profession and prestige of The Institute.

Selections of those to continue was made by The Board by ballot - in many instances only after prolonged balloting.

Although you have not been selected to continue, The Board has requested me to convey to you its deep gratitude for the service you have rendered and expresses the hope that in the not too distant future further opportunity will be given to call upon you again.
