

Other fields entered by graduates include architectural delineation, furniture designing and stage design.





It is good to hear from you again - although you do present rather a troublesome matter.

First, for your information, The Board disbanded The Committee on Membership, as such, at its last meeting in San Francisco, and The Secretary, Roy Carroll, now acts as a Committee of one to pass on applications which are cleared through this office and found to be in order.

Any questions which may arise are to be referred to The Secretary for decision; or, if he feels it would be necessary, to The Board of Directors itself, for decision.

Perhaps the best procedume in the case you describe would be to refer it to Mr. Garroll for his opinion. If a Committee on Membership still existed, as heretofore, that is the action I would take; i.e., to refer your letter to the members for discussion at its next meeting.

Enclosed is a current application form, from which you will note that endorsements are no longer required. References must be supplied by the applicant, three of whom must be corporate members "available for personal contact by the local chapter officers." The By-laws require that the five persons named by the applicant must reside in the Regional District.

There were precedents in connection with other applicants in the jurisdiction of the Rhode Island Chapter, whose elections were voted by The Board over the Chapter's unfavorable recommendations. However, in these instances, there were reports provided by the Chapter.

Does the architect about whom you write have anything in writing from the Chapter? Or has his application been processed through the Chapter and forwarded by it to The Institute with unfavorable recommendation? In the latter situation, I should think The Secretary, on behalf of The Board, could intervene and reconsider denial of election on the basis of favorable reports such as your present letter.

I am leaving tonight to be away on vacation for the rest of July, and will be back August 1st.

In the meantime, I am passing your letter along to Mr. Purves, with copy of this reply, to see if he wishes to add anything to what I have written.

If, in the meantime, you want to write further in this matter, you might address your letter to Mr. Purves for his attention if anything would be required.
