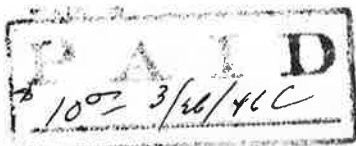

Thank you for your letter of October 30.

With reference to the members who are not paying dues to you and no longer reside in your area, we think the best thing to do is for your Chapter to recommend their membership terminations for nonpayment of local dues, specifying the year(s) and amount of indebtedness.
