

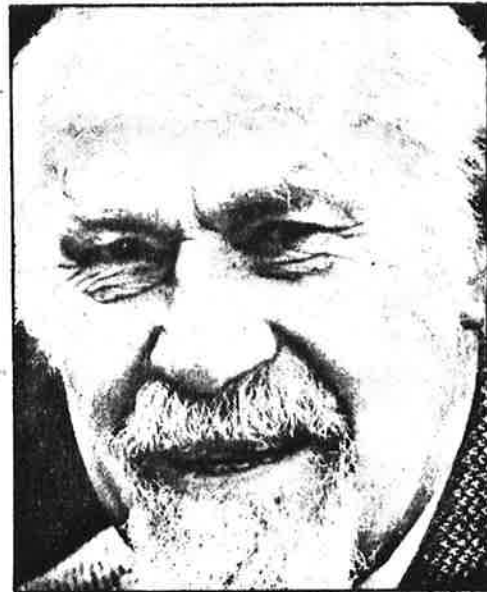
Services will be held Saturday for the late Theodore "Ted" Criley Jr., a Claremont architect who died Saturday, September 15 at the age of 79.

"Ted was very much a gentleman but somewhat of a Bohemian," said Fred McDowell, his partner in a Claremont architecture firm for more than 20 years.

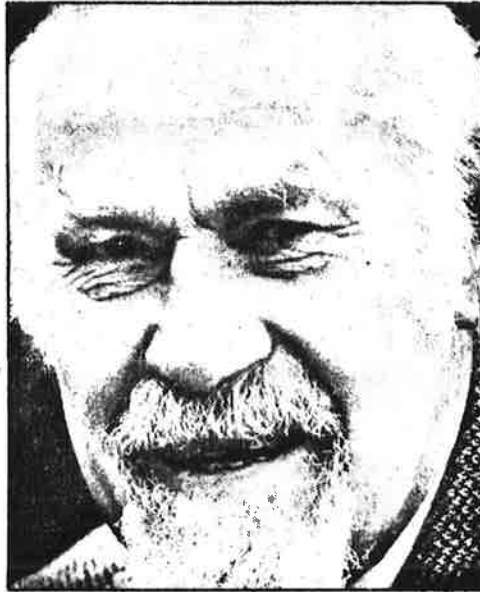
