So, though we cannot say who will build the laws, or reconstitute them, nor when, we are assured that the material for such illuminating rediscovery and revival cannot be too fully or too painstakingly assembled; that its value is beyond our powers of calculation.

We hope that Professor Goodyear's researches may be widely extended, and that

they may be most carefully preserved, in such wise as to make them at all times and permanently available to all those who shall possess enough of interest and intelligence to make use of them.
