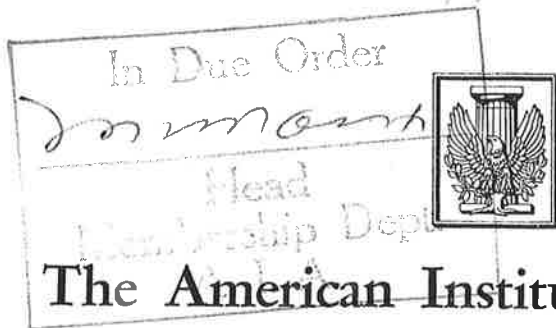



We recently received some correspondence from the AIA which indicated you were requesting re-instatement. We had lost track of you the last time you left the country and are glad to hear you will be returning.

There is a point concerning your membership that I should clarify. As you may or may not remember, our by-laws as well as those of the National (AIA), require that a corporate member cannot belong to only one organization but must belong to both State and National.
