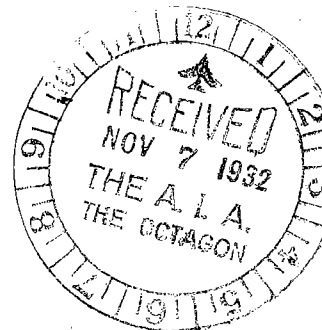

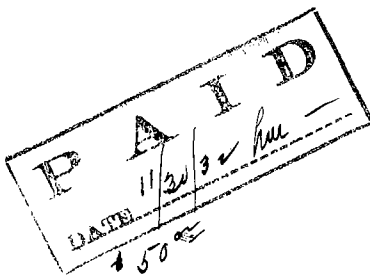

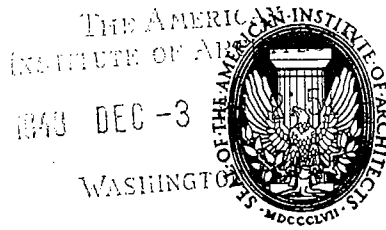

Funeral Held For Architect DAILY PACIFIC BUILDER Jan 18 52

Funeral services were conducted this week for Mark Daniels, former Assistant Secretary of the Interior and noted California architect and landscape engineer.

Mr. Daniels, 70, died Monday following an extended illness.

A graduate of the University of California, Mr. Daniels first gained recognition as the designer of many roads and vistas in Yosemite National Park. Later he was Assistant Secretary of the Interior under President Wilson.

His most recent work was as senior architect on the original plans for the Ping Yuen housing project in Chinatown.

Private funeral services were held here Tuesday for Mark Daniels, San Francisco architect, landscapist, and city planner, who died Monday in Franklin Hospital after a long illness. He was 70.

A native of Michigan, Mr. Daniels studied at the University of California and started his career as a landscape engineer in 1914 when he was hired to plan improvements at Yosemite National Park.

From 1914 to 1916, he was general superintendent and landscape engineer for all United States National Parks. He was a captain in the Army Engineers during World War I. In later years, he designed the Pebble Beach and Bel Air golf courses, the Municipal Auditorium in Santa Cruz, and the estates of many prominent persons in California.

He served as landscape architect for the Golden Gate International Exposition; was senior architect for the U. S. Housing Administration, drawing plans for San Francisco's Ping Yuen project in Chinatown; and was appointed to the San Francisco Art Commission by Mayor Angelo J. Rossi in 1943, serving as commission president two years later.

He wrote many monographs on architectural and planning matters, as well as a number of plays, many of which were performed for the Bohemian and Family clubs. Mr. Daniels was a member of both those organizations, as well as of many professional societies, and, at Berkeley, the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity.

Mr. Daniels is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ruth Daniels of 115 Buckingham way. A son, Mark Daniels Jr., died in September, 1949.

Interment was at Woodlawn Memorial Park, Tuesday.
