

SEVENTH COMPETITION,

PRELIMINARY EXERCISE FOR THE FRANCIS J. PLYM FELLOWSHIP
IN ARCHITECTURE - 1917.

REPORT OF JUDGMENT.

In compliance with the invitation and regulations governing the competition for the Francis J. Plym Fellowship in Architecture for the year 1917, as contained in the announcement issued under date of December 14, 1916, applications were received and filed from sixteen graduates of the Department of Architecture of the University of Illinois.

The subject of the preliminary exercise was a "Building for the Department of Architecture", and the time allotted for making the drawings was five successive days between January 20 and January 31.

Two of the registered applicants withdrew, three failed to submit drawings.

Eleven packages properly marked were duly received at the office of Frederick W. Perkins, Chicago, and the fellowship committee met at that place on February 13th at 2 P.M., to consider the drawings submitted in accordance with the regulations. The packages in their inner wrappers only were presented to the committee and as they were opened they and their accompanying sealed envelopes were numbered in due succession from one to eleven. The committee then examined the drawings and found all to conform in all respects to the conditions imposed.

After careful examination and comparison, the committee selected drawings numbered 3, 4, 9 and 10 as showing satisfactory work. The envelopes which accompanied the drawings were then opened and contained the following names:

- No. 3 - Erwin O. Christensen
- No. 4 - Henry Dubin
- No. 9 - Temple Hoyne Buell
- No. 10 - Fred G. Rounds

The committee declared these competitors to be eligible for the final exercise.

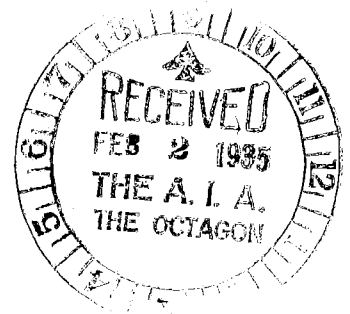

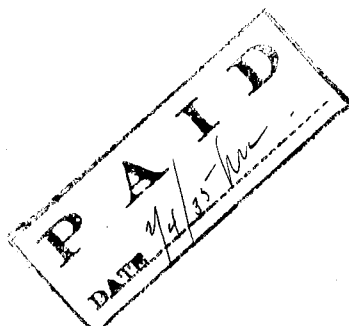
