2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

Bakersfield City Hall - One of the earliest public buildings employing the lift-slab method of construction. Many of the present-day details and methods of lift-slab were developed and pioneered on this job with highly satisfactory results.

Lincoln Savings Building - On this relatively small, but extremely high priced site in downtown Los Angeles, the architects were able to convince the owners of the value of a noticeable setback from the property line in order to better enhance the main facade with attractive landscaping.

Bakersfield Savings Building - This high rise savings & loan and office building was planned in two phases. However, from economic analysis and special research work by the architects, the owners elected to build the entire concept following verification of the architect's original analysis and research report...an example of how an architect can offer an additional and vital service to his client by preparing a comprehensive and realistic economic analysis of income property as well as the additional prestige value of good architecture in a highly competitive field of banking and finance.

Administration Building, Kern County Union High School and College District - By employing new methods of space assignment and "common" areas for secretarial employees, the architects were able to save considerable area in planning this facility and thus build an extremely functional administration building within the limits of a very "tight" budget.

<u>Vignolo Residence</u>- Selected by ARCHITECTURAL DIGEST as an outstanding example of architect-decorator-landscape architect team work for a large prestige residence in Central California.

Foothill High School - This new high school planned for 1500 students was particularly noteworthy because the School District was able to completely air condition all facilities as a result of planning and construction methods recommended and devised by the architects which resulted in sufficient savings in cost to more than offset the additional cost of year round air conditioning.

State of California, State Building Standards Commission

Appointed by the Governor in June, 1959, to serve as the Architect Member of the Commission. The State Director of Finance is Chairman. There are ten members: three from among the professions serving the construction industry of whom one shall be an architect, a structural engineer, and a contractor. The remaining members are appointed from the building trades and the general public.

The purpose of the Commission is to:

- (1) Prepare and publish a single code of all administrative building regulations of state agencies relating to building standards which are enforced or supervised by state agencies.
- (2) Approve all building regulations prepared by state agencies.
- (3) Review and analyze all existing and proposed state building regulations for possible conflict, overlap, and duplication with other state and national building regulations and codes.
- (4) Conduct special sub-committee investigations and hearings on code problems when required.

Members serve without compensation, meet at least once each month, plus required special sub-committee meetings.

Was re-appointed by the Governor to second four-year term in 1963 representing the architects of California.

Additional responsibilities as member of this Commission require: attendance as member of California Council A.I.A., Code Committee at their regular meetings..liaison with Executive Committee California Council, A.I.A., and Southern California Chapter, A.I.A., on statewide code matters.

Average time spent during past five years representing profession has been approximately four days per month.
