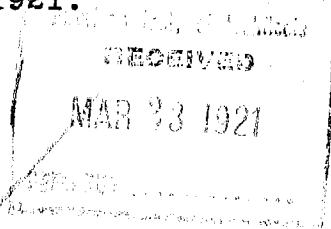

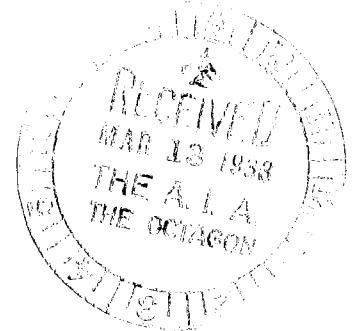

The Board of Directors passed a resolution at their meeting of March 6th., recommending that the membership of J.B.Elliott be discontinued in the Institute for non-payment of dues.

At the March meeting of the Board of Directors of the Institute, your membership in the Institute and the Pittsburgh Chapter was discontinued, effective March 15, 1933, for non-payment of Chapter dues.

It is hoped very much that improving conditions will permit you to adjust your account with the Chapter and to take steps to restore the affiliation, both with the Institute and the Chapter.

The termination became effective March 15, 1933, and was in no sense a special case.

There were other members on the same list, and the Board followed the established procedure in matters of this kind.
