INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANT

1. Read the by-laws, the rules and regulations, and the Standards of Practice of The Institute and the by-laws and rules and regulations of the chapter to which you desire to be assigned.
2. Fill in, with *typewriting*, on both the original and the duplicate form, every blank space under items numbered 1 to 28 inclusive, (except under the items not applicable to your case) on pages numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.
3. Sign on pages 2 and 6, and have your two proposers sign on page 6, both the original and the duplicate application, in the spaces provided therefor.
4. File the duplicate application with the secretary of the chapter to which you wish to be assigned, and obtain his receipt therefor.
5. Attach to your original application:
 - (a) The chapter's receipt for your duplicate application;
 - (b) Your check for the admission fee and the current annual dues of The Institute;
 - (c) All photographs and photostat copies of documents required by the application. These photographs and photostats must be 8" x 10" in size, or mounted on sheets of that size.
6. Mail your original application with its attachments by registered mail, return receipt requested, to The Secretary of The American Institute of Architects, The Octagon, 1741 New York Avenue, Washington, D. C.

7. You will expedite the progress of your application by *fully* complying with the above instructions. If your application is not complete, with all attachments required, it will be returned to you for correction or additions.
8. If you have no certificate of registration issued to you by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, or if you have not been examined and duly registered as an architect or licensed to practice architecture by an official state board, or if such certificate of registration or license has been issued by a board whose examinations are not satisfactory to The Board of Examiners of The Institute, you may be requested by The Board of Examiners to furnish to it additional evidence of your professional qualifications. Such evidence must be furnished promptly on request, carriage prepaid. It will be returned in due course.

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

Any architect living in the United States or in its territories or possessions, whether or not a citizen of the United States, may be admitted to membership in The American Institute of Architects if he satisfies its Board of Directors that he has adequate professional qualifications, an honorable standing in his profession and community, and is able to undertake the pecuniary obligations of the membership.

An applicant for membership must be vouched for by two members of The Institute who must sign his application as proposers.

A member, by virtue of his membership in The Institute, becomes a member of the chapter of The Institute within the territory of which he resides or has his place of business, as he elects, but he pays an admission fee to The Institute only. The admission fee to membership in The Institute normally is twenty-five dollars. (For 1936 this fee was reduced to five dollars.)

A member pays annual dues both to The Institute and to the chapter. The annual dues to The Institute normally are twenty-five dollars (for 1936 Institute dues were reduced to twenty dollars) and those to the chapter are fixed in its by-laws.

Normally the period between the time of filing

an application and the time it is acted on by The Board of The Institute is four months. The period will be longer if the application must be returned to the applicant for corrections or if additional exhibits of the applicant's work are required by The Board of Examiners.

If an application is denied, the amount prepaid by the applicant for annual dues and for admission fee, less five dollars for examination fee, will be returned to him.

An applicant whose application has been denied without prejudice may reapply for admission to membership a year or more after the date of The Secretary's notice to him of his non-admission.

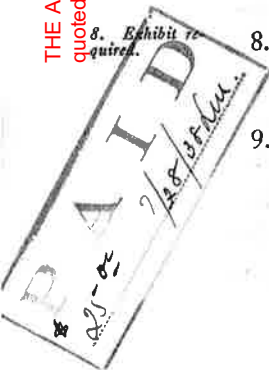




We are sorry to receive your letter of June 22nd advising that you wish to resign your corporate membership in The Institute and the Chicago Chapter to which you are assigned.





Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge Mr. Simon's letter of March 18, 1954.

Prior to the war, I was in practice by myself for a period of approximately two and one-half years. During this time, responsibility for design was entirely my own.

In 1940, I became associated with Paul Schweikher and T. W. Lamb. Until March of 1942, when the office was closed because of the war, design responsibility was for the most part taken by the one responsible for getting the job. We discovered during this period that the working of such an organization was confused, with much overlapping of functions.

Mr. Lamb was killed during the war, and when Mr. Schweikher and I opened our office again, we set forth clearly our respective duties and functions. It was agreed that while Mr. Schweikher and I were to consult on matters of design and in busy times both share in it as specific occasions arose, Mr. Schweikher was to have the final decision. Final decision in other aspects of the partnership were assumed by me.

When Mr. Schweikher moved to New Haven in September, 1943 to take over the chairmanship of Yale University's School of Architecture, the above procedure was continued whether design originated in this office or in New Haven.

Of the two buildings presented to the Jury, the house in Libertyville, Illinois is my own. I live there. Thus the greater part of the design responsibility was mine. The Maryville Fine Arts Center came to this office through a friend of mine, and thus the design responsibility was shared to a greater extent than normally. For these reasons the two buildings were selected from others.

If you so wish, I would be glad to submit photographs of buildings entirely designed by me prior to the association in 1940.


