

The 1979 Chapter Nominating Committee comprised of the four most immediate past presidents of the Chapter, held its meeting on September 6, 1979.

George E. Hartman, FAIA, Chairman, presented to the September Executive Board Meeting his Committee's recommendations as nominees for Chapter office for 1980 and reported that the following nominees have agreed to stand for election:

(Joseph C. Giuliani, AIA, 1979 Vice President/President Elect, will assume the office of President of the Chapter in 1980.)

The Board wishes to remind the membership that although this is the 1979 Committee's slate, all members are urged to attend the Business Meeting to exercise their voting privilege and to make nominations from the floor if they have candidates who are willing to serve. There is one restriction with respect to candidates for the office of Vice President/President Elect according to the Bylaws and that is "... that each nominee for the office of Vice President/President Elect shall have served at least one year on the Executive Board."

NOMINEES for WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN CHAPTER OFFICERS - 1980

AVERY C. FAULKNER - Vice President/President Elect

Mr. Faulkner received his Masters of Architecture from Yale University in 1955 and is the Senior Partner of the firm of Faulkner, Fryer & Vanderpool. He became an Associate of the Chapter in 1956 and has been a Member of the Institute since 1964. Mr. Faulkner served as Chairman of the Chapter Committee for Historic Resources - 1971-74, as Director-at-Large - 1976-77, as Treasurer in 1978 and is currently acting as Chapter Secretary. He is Chairman of the Octagon Committee and served as Vice President of the AIA Foundation - 1976-78; is now serving on the Foundation Board. He was Chairman of the Board of the Potomac School - 1976-78 and in 1977 Mr. Faulkner served as a visiting critic in design at Catholic University.

LEON CHATELAIN III - Secretary

Mr. Chatelain received his Bachelor of Architecture degree from Rhode Island School of Design in 1968; is registered in Maryland, Virginia, District of Columbia, West Virginia and Delaware, and has his own firm in Leesburg, Virginia. He has been a Member of the Institute since 1972, maintains membership in the Construction Specifications Institute, and is an Affiliate of the American Planning Association. Mr. Chatelain has served as Chairman of the Chapter Committees on Legislative Liaison, Financial Management Systems and D. C. Tax on Professionals in 1975. During 1976 he served as Commissioner of Chapter Affairs, Chairman of the Committee on Liability Legislation and Co-Chairman of the Joint Task Force on D. C. Design Contracts for D. C. Architects. He served as Chapter Director-at-Large - 1977-78 and is currently acting as Chapter Treasurer. He has been a member of the National Committee on Environmental Education - 1973-75. Mr. Chatelain is past Director of the Kiwanis Club of Washington, D. C. and is a Director and First Vice President of the D. C. Society for Crippled Children. He is also a delegate and serves on a National Committee for the National Easter Seal Society.

CHARLES H. ATHERTON - Treasurer

Mr. Atherton received his Master of Fine Arts from Princeton University in 1957. He was Assistant Secretary to the Fine Arts Commission - 1960-64, and since 1964 has served as Secretary. He is currently a member of the Senior Executive Service and is on the Interdepartmental Task Force on Women and as liaison with the President's program on strengthening Black Colleges. Mr. Atherton has been a Member of the Institute since 1972 and has served on the Chapter Historic Resources Committee since 1974. He is currently Chapter Senior Director-at-Large. He has been a member of the Columbia Historical Society since 1970 and is now Chairman of the Christian Heurich Mansion Preservation Committee. He has been a lecturer with the Smithsonian Residents Associates Program since 1970, a member of the National Child Research Center Board of Directors - 1975-79 and Chairman of its Facilities Committee - 1978-79. Mr. Atherton is a member of the Potomac Boat Club.

SARA P. O'NEIL-MANION - Director-at-Large

Ms. O'Neil-Manion is a principal in the firm of O'Neil & Manion Architects P.A. She has been a Member of the Institute since 1976 and holds a Bachelor of Architecture degree from Catholic University. She is registered in Maryland and the District of Columbia.

Ms. O'Neil-Manion is currently on the Chapter Executive Board as a Director and has served on the Membership Committee since 1977, presently acting as its Chairman. Other activities include lecturing for the Chapter Associate Committee's exam seminars and the Department of Labor Statistics Bureau. Ms. O'Neil-Manion assisted in the preparation of the Chapter Notebook.

From 1967 through 1970 he held architectural review authority for the design of all U.S. Air Force medical facilities and also served as consultant to the White House on health care facilities for the Executive Branch. He has been a Member of AIA since 1973 and has served on the Chapter Health Facilities Committee and is currently in his fifth term as a member of the AIA National Committee on Architecture for Health. This past year he has been a Director on the Chapter Executive Board. He is a member of the Professional Services Business Management Association and is active in a number of community organizations in Reston. Mr. Tobey was recently selected by the D.C. Chamber of Commerce for a special trade mission to Egypt to assist in developing joint venture opportunities between small and medium size businesses in the District of Columbia and the Middle East.

Avery Faulkner has designed or been the partner-in-charge of design for a broad range of building types including private residences, school and college buildings, hospitals, museums, and zoological exhibits as well as Master Plans for universities and zoological parks. His residential and zoological work has been published in books and magazines in this country and in Europe.

Buildings for whose design the nominee was responsible and which have received local or national design recognition include the Avery Faulkner Residence, McLean, Virginia; the Ward Circle Classroom Building, The American University; Classroom and Office Building for George Washington University; National Portrait Gallery & National Collection of Fine Arts, Washington, D. C.; the Lion and Tiger Exhibit at the National Zoo in Washington, and the Holy Cross Hospital, Silver Spring, Maryland. The nominee's work is noted for its individual response to unique program and site requirements as well as for simplicity of form.

The nominee has served as Vice-President of the A.I.A. Foundation and is Chairman of the Octagon Committee. Under his stewardship, The Octagon and The Foundation have both increased significantly in their service to the profession and to the public. In 1977 the Institute awarded the nominee a Special Citation as Chairman of the Octagon Committee for exceptional service to the profession. As Chairman of the Historic Resources Committee of the Washington Chapter, A.I.A., he initiated the annual "Historic Preservation Design Awards" program. The nominee is now Chapter Vice-President and President-Elect. He has taught Architectural Design at three universities. His service to the Institute, his chapter and to the profession have been consistent and widely recognized.
