# **Synopsis**

The program required the design of a public swimming pool complex. The design process began addressing the site's flooding parameters by raising the finished floor elevations of the pool and enclosing its terraces within a berm. Two trellised colonnades over eating and lounging areas embrace an observation tower that creates a project landmark while affording future opportunities of linkages with the near mountain landscape. 

# Synopsis

The City of Caguas commissioned the development of Regional Park on a mountain site adjacent to its urban center. The project provides a physical and symbolic gateway to 300 acres of a mountain side preserve. The ceremonial entrance portal houses an amphiteater, a lake, a children's playground, a chairlift, and support facilities. Made of simple unadorned materials such as exposed concrete, iron grills, and steel cables, this project strives to derive maximum aesthetic potential from these straightforward elements. The wooden 'pergola' suspended on the cable structure suggests the grand roof of a recreation 'temple' while serving as a feature of the entire region.



# Synopsis

The program required the design of a "publico van" terminal to provide 395 car spaces in a 3-story structure. The project site is located adjacent to the historical zone in the center of Ponce. In the southeast corner of the project's site an existing church, and in the north-east corner an existing house were incorporated into the project. Daylight floods the interior elevated street so as to encourage street vendors and other urban sidewalk activities as part of the project's amenities in keeping with other commercial interior pedestrian streets or lineal plazas in Ponce. The "público" drop-off activity takes place in another open courtyard, to culminate the interior pedestrian street axis. The project elevations, enhanced by articulated prefabricated concrete panels, are reminiscent of the stately scale prevalent in the old city.

# **Synopsis**

The Municipality of San Juan required the consolidation of 350 mini-vans within the congested central business district streets of Río Piedras. The project strengthens urban realtionships to important urban pedestrian generators such as the Paseo de Diego (main pedestrian street-mail); the Plaza de Mercado (town market place); the Autoridad Metropolitana de Autobuses (bus terminal); and the residential zones of Capuchino and Buen Consejo. To do so the ground floor required a 45° displacement from the ortogonal urban fabric followed on the upper parking floors. The boarding platforms are in keeping with the Puerto Rican town central plaza typology (público's park around the central plazas). The immediate periphery is enclosed by a colon-

# Synopsis

An existing basketball court on a corner lot adjacent to the main town square was substituted by a mini-van car transportation terminal on the ground floor and a new basketball court on the second floor. The existing structure was raised to a second floor to accommodate the new basketball court. The raising of the existing structure allowed for a vehicular flow redefinition. Thus, a new interior street was cut under the court so as to provide peripheral parking around a central hall. The project's exterior vocabulary pays tribute to the Art Deco forms of an adjacent school structure dating from the 1930's. The second floor opens to overlook the central town square. The lattice grills present an economic and safe air handling device.



# Synopsis

A mini-van 'público' transportation terminal was built between a government center and a fire station to complete a public service block in the Municipality of Dorado. The project site was part of the government center's The design solution required the use of air rights over the parking lot. existing parking lot. The project, while oriented to the main street in the town, provides a pedestrian entrance at the back street so as to interconnect both streets through a passageway or interior street over cascading stairs. The interior pedestrian street doubles as the waiting and boarding area for the mini-vans. The grillwork, common to Puerto Rico breaks away from its traditional role, within window or door openings, to constitute a formal decorative element. The continuous front facade plane anchors the government building to the rest of the city block.







# Synopsis

The small "bungalow" on Pacific Place dates from the thirties, and is typical of Frank Lloyd Wright's prairie style. The local exponents of the prairie sytle in Puerto Rico were architects Antonin Nechodoma and Pedro de Castro, to whom the original structure is attributed. The design solution searched for retaining the scale of the original structure. The spanish floor tiles were maintained. New mosaics were added in keeping with the original design. Likewise the awnings on the south and west sides were substituted with pergolas that increased the galleries while adding privacy. Small fences at the sidewalk, only two feet away of the structure, were removed and converted into gardens on the sidewalk. Said gardens now express the base of the structure giving it a greater street presence while reinforcing its urban condition. The project demonstrates how 'big' a house on a small (300 square meters) lot can be.





# Synopsis

The site is a tight, irregular, urban plot of land with access from three existing streets. The design concept aimed at urbanizing this area of the town. The project uses the town square typology common to Puerto Rico. (The design included a 'públic' terminal, a market place, a sports center, and the refurnishing of the main town square). The market place and the sports center gravitate around the mini-vans terminal plaza establishing a transverse pedestrian axis. All buildings in the area, are proposed on the sidewalk's property-line so as to reinforce the existing character of the old town. Each building design 'parti' revolves around an octagon, a form commonplace in Guayanilla. Each octagon is expressed within a different building type.





An existing cementery in a small town in Puerto Rico required new burial facilities: a chapel, a mausoleum, and 30 parking spaces on a very accidented site. The chapel design is inspired on the original town church demolished in the 1960's to make way for a new modern church. 



MUNICIPAL CEMETERY / SITE PLAN




AGUAS BUENAS MUNICIPAL CEMETERY / SECOND FLOOR AND ROOF PLAN

# Synopsis

# Synopsis

This planning project's focus is on the Housing Department as a catalyst. an ally and a colaborator of the tendencies of residental market; buying and selling housing to improve the living conditions of these three rural communities. 

# URBAN DESIGN

Our client is the Housing Department of Puerto Rico. New solutions are explored for typical marginalized communities which occur on the outskirts of towns across the Island.

Our pliot program takes place in the town of Utuado, toward the center of the Island, in three landsilde-prone communities known as: La Granja, Judea and Los Pinos. The urban design phase began in January of 1992. Improvements are designed for both vehicular circulation and predestrian walkway throughout the communities, with recreational areas inserted where necessary.


A project office was opened in June 1992, in Los Pinos, where data is being collected to form a socio-economic profile of the communities. Preliminary designs for short-term projects one of which has been under construction since the middle of August, were developed in a summer studio during July and August. All new interventions are informed by the existing context.


A Master Plan for the town includes a walkway recognizing the river's edge and the completion of a vehicular loop around the town center, with a round about at the entrance of each community. Due to the landsilde condition many families will be relocated within the community or town. Deteriorated homes will be acquired and demolished to alleviate the terrain of excess weight, an action based on the results of a geological soil study.


Both the Housing Department and the Housing Bank have allotted funds for reconstruction and relocation through low interest bans. Other government agencies are involved in the financing of the project such as: Farmer Home Administration; Mutual Help, P.R.F.S.. Rental Rehabilitation suggested "infili housing", which is a new approach to public housing. Infili housing consists of small housing projects, eight to twenty units, built on empty lots throughout the communities.


At all levels of intervention the underlying attitude is one of respect and recognition of the existing conditions. The resident's efforts are enhanced by these interventions. As the government shows willingness to improve roads, sidewalks, stairs, sanitary systems, and other infrastructure, it is our hope that the residents will be motivated to improve thier private sectors.


















AXONOMETRIC OF INFILL HOUSING EXISTING HOUSING UNIT
