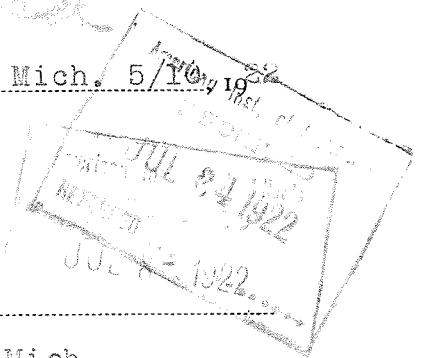

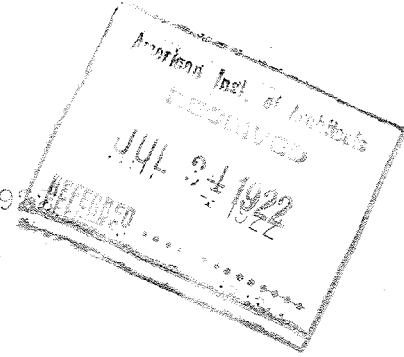



As I am back on the job, as of today, I am writing in response to your inquiry of March 25th addressed to Ned Purves.

From our records we find that Elmer George Kiebler's membership in The Institute was terminated on December 31, 1946, for indebtedness for Institute dues for 1945 and 1946 in the total amount of \$32.00.

As you know, upon application for readmission, those dues would have to be paid in full, plus \$30.00 for the readmission fee (\$5.00) and one year's Institute dues in advance (\$25.00). And if there was any outstanding indebtedness for chapter dues those also would have to be taken care of.


